## INITIATING PROCEEDINGS FOR REPRESENTATION OF INDEPENDENT SPECIAL DISTRICTS ON THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION FOR SAN MATEO COUNTY AND FOR THE ADOPTION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

WHEREAS, California Government Code Sections 56300 et seq. provide that a county's Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCO") shall be enlarged from five to seven members, with the two additional members being appointed by the independent special districts within the County, if a majority of such special districts adopt resolutions proposing (1) representation of special districts on LAFCO, and (2) adoption by LAFCO of regulations affecting the functions and services of special districts; and

WHEREAS, the Broadmoor Police Protection District is an independent special district as defined in Government Code Section 56044 and is situated entirely within San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners believe that the public interest will be served by the representation of independent special districts on LAFCO and is willing to authorize LAFCO to adopt regulations affecting the function and services of special districts.

WHEREAS, the remaining process for selection of Independent Special District Members to the Local Agency Formation Commission requires that the president or chairman of each Independent Special District (or the designee by resolution) meet and determine a process to elect two Independent Special District representatives to the Local Agency Formation Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District as follows:



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RESOLUTION 1995/96- 04

The Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby repeals District Resolution 1990/91-08 and District Resolution 1995/96-02 and enacts the following District Resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District of the County of San Mateo finds that the district incurs costs and expenses in connection with the arrest and processing of arrested persons; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to place such financial burden, to the extent possible, upon those persons arrested for and convicted of offenses by requiring such persons to reimburse the District for costs and expenses incurred by the District in connection with such arrests:

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to defray, to the extent possible, the administrative cost to the District of towing and storing or impounding motor vehicles and processing the paperwork relating to vehicles that have been towed and stored or impounded incident to an arrest by a member or employee of the District;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

**SECTION 1:** (a) In all cases where a person is arrested without a warrant by a District police officer for a violation of section 23152 or section 23153 of the Vehicle Code, and such person is transported to a police station, correctional facility or other place of confinement, including First Chance North, or First Chance South, and such person is convicted, whether by plea of guilty, plea of no contest or by trial, of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, as follows:

(1) For offenses occurring on and after January 1, 1988, to and including December 31, 1990, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$250.00. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1988.

(2) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1991, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$300.00, plus any costs and expenses, if any, charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991. (3) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1995, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$350.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1995.

(4) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1996, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$450.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1996.

(b) In all cases where a person is arrested, pursuant to a warrant, by a member of the Broadmoor Police Department and booked into a correctional facility or other place of confinement, and such person is convicted, whether by plea of guilty, plea of no contest or by trial, of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, the actual cost charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991.

(c) The Chief of Police shall forthwith adopt appropriate procedures for implementing this program.

(d) The foregoing provisions shall also apply to arrests in those cases where a District police officer receives an arrestee from another agency or from a private person pursuant to a private person's or citizen's arrest.

**SECTION 2:** In all cases where a District police officer or District employee tows and stores or impounds any motor vehicle, as required or permitted by law, such vehicle shall not be released by the facility keeping such vehicle unless and until a written form of release is issued to that facility by the Chief of Police, or by a person designated by the Chief of Police to issue such release, authorizing the facility to release the stored or towed vehicle. As a condition precedent to the issuance of such form of release, the Chief of Police or the person authorized by the Chief of Police, shall demand and collect an administrative fee therefor as follows:

(a) For each Vehicle Release issued until March 31, 1996, the fee shall be \$70.00;

(b) For each release issued on and after April 1, 1996, the fee shall be \$80.00.

**SECTION 3:** (a) For good cause shown the Chief of Police may waive in whole or in part the assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution.

A person seeking relief in whole or in part from the (b) assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution shall file an application therefor on oath, on a form promulgated by the Chief of Police, which shall set forth the specific reasons justifying the relief requested. Such form shall be filed with the Records Clerk of the Police Department within twenty days of the date of The Chief of Police may, for good the notice of assessment. cause shown, extend the time within which to file the application for relief or permit the applicant to file his or application late, but in no event shall any extension be granted, or a late claim accepted, beyond thirty days from the date the claim should have been timely filed in the first instance. Not more than one extension of time shall be granted. Any application for relief from the assessment not timely filed or not filed in accordance with this provision shall be returned to the applicant and shall not be considered.

(c) If the applicant is dissatisfied with the decision of the Chief of Police, whether on the merits of an application for relief from the assessment or upon an application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application, such applicant may request a review <u>de novo</u> by the Board of Police Commissioners of the decision of the Chief of Police. Such request for review shall be in writing and shall be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners not later than ten days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant. No special form or technical language is required. A letter requesting review of the decision of the Chief of Police is.

(d) In the event that no request for review of the decision of the Chief of Police is filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the ten days specified in subdivision (C), the decision of the Chief of Police shall become final within the agency.

For good cause shown the Board of Police Commissioners may extend the time within which to file a request for review of the Decision of the Chief of Police or grant leave to file a late request for such review. No extension of time beyond thirty days from the date the application should have been timely filed shall be granted, and no more than one application for an extension shall be granted. An application for an extension of time or an application for leave to file a late request for review shall be made in writing on oath filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the times specified herein. An application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application for relief from the assessment must be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within thirty days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant unless the applicant has obtained an extension of time or leave has been granted to present a late The Board of Police Commissioners shall not grant application. any application for leave to file a late request for review beyond thirty days after a timely request for review should have been timely filed in the first instance.

(1) The decision of the Board of Police Commissioners shall be in writing and shall become final immediately upon rendition. The decision shall be delivered to the applicant personally, or it may be mailed to the applicant at the address shown in the application.

**SECTION 4:** No District police officer or District employee shall provide to any person or other entity, except allied law enforcement and other public agencies, copies of District police reports to which the person requesting such report is lawfully entitled to receive, without first demanding and collecting a fee of \$30.00 for each such report requested.

The Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby repeals District Resolution 1990/91-08 and District Resolution 1993/94-04 and enacts the following District Resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District of the County of San Mateo finds that the district incurs costs and expenses in connection with the arrest and processing of arrested persons; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to place such financial burden, to the extent possible, upon those persons arrested for and convicted of offenses by requiring such persons to reimburse the District for costs and expenses incurred by the District in connection with such arrests;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to defray, to the extent possible, the cost to the District of towing and storing or impounding, and administratively processing such vehicles that have been towed and stored or impounded incident to an arrest by a member or employee of the District;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

SECTION 1: (a) In all cases where a person is arrested without a warrant by a District police officer for a violation of section 23152 or section 23153 of the Vehicle Code, and such person is transported to a police station, correctional facility or other place of confinement, including First Chance North, or First Chance South, and is convicted of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, as follows:

(1) For offenses occurring on and after January 1, 1988, to and including December 31, 1990, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$250.00. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1988.

(2) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1991, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$300.00, plus any costs and expenses, if any, charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991.

This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1995.

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(b) In all cases where a person is arrested, pursuant to a warrant, by a member of the Broadmoor Police Department and booked into a correctional facility or other place of confinement, and such person is convicted of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, the actual cost charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991.

(c) The Chief of Police shall forthwith adopt appropriate procedures for implementing this program.

(d) The foregoing provisions shall also apply to arrests in those cases where a District police officer receives an arrestee from another agency or from a private person pursuant to a private person's or citizen's arrest.

**SECTION 2:** In all cases where a District police officer or District employee tows and stores or impounds any motor vehicle, as required or permitted by law, such vehicle shall not be released by the facility keeping such vehicle unless and until a written form of release is issued to that facility by the Chief of Police, or by a person designated by the Chief of Police to issue such release, authorizing the facility to release the stored or towed vehicle. As a condition precedent to the issuance of such form of release, the Chief of Police or the person authorized by the Chief of Police, shall demand and collect an administrative fee therefor as follows:

(a) For each release issued to and including March 31, 1991, the fee shall be \$30.00;

(b) For each release issued on and after April 1, 1991, the fee shall be \$40.00;

(c) For each release issued on and after September 1, 1993, the fee shall be \$50.00.

(d) For each release issued on and after March 15, 1995, the fee shall be \$70.00.

**SECTION 3:** (a) For good cause shown the Chief of Police may waive in whole or in part the assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution.

A person seeking relief in whole or in part from the (b) assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution shall file an application therefor on oath, on a form promulgated by the Chief of Police, which shall set forth the specific reasons justifying the relief requested. Such form shall be filed with the Records Clerk of the Police Department within twenty days of the date of the notice of assessment. The Chief of Police may, for good cause shown, extend the time within which to file the application for relief or permit the applicant to file his or application late, but in no event shall any extension be granted, or a late claim accepted, beyond thirty days from the date the claim should have been timely filed in the first instance. Not more than one extension of time shall be granted. Any application for relief from the assessment not timely filed or not filed in accordance with this provision shall be returned to the applicant and shall not be considered.

(c) If the applicant is dissatisfied with the decision of the Chief of Police, whether on the merits of an application for relief from the assessment or upon an application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application, such applicant may request a review <u>de novo</u> by the Board of Police Commissioners of the decision of the Chief of Police. Such request for review shall be in writing and shall be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners not later than ten days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant. No special form or technical language is required. A letter requesting review of the decision of the Chief of Police is.

(d) In the event that no request for review of the decision of the Chief of Police is filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the ten days specified in subdivision (c), the decision of the Chief of Police shall become final within the agency.

For good cause shown the Board of Police Commissioners (e) may extend the time within which to file a request for review of the Decision of the Chief of Police or grant leave to file a late request for such review. No extension of time beyond thirty days from the date the application should have been timely filed shall be granted, and no more than one application for an extension shall be granted. An application for an extension of time or an application for leave to file a late request for review shall be made in writing on oath filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the times specified herein. An application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application for relief from the assessment must be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within thirty days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant unless the applicant has obtained an extension of time or leave has been granted to present a late

application. The Board of Police Commissioners shall not grant any application for leave to file a late request for review beyond thirty days after a timely request for review should have been timely filed in the first instance.

(1) The decision of the Board of Police Commissioners shall be in writing and shall become final immediately upon rendition. The decision shall be delivered to the applicant personally, or it may be mailed to the applicant at the address shown in the application.

**SECTION 4:** Effective September 1, 1993, no District police officer or District employee shall provide to any person or other entity, except allied law enforcement and other public agencies, copies of District police reports to which the person requesting such report is lawfully entitled to receive, without demanding and collecting a fee of \$30.00 for each such report requested.

# AMENDED RESOLUTION 1999/2000 - 09

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS OF THE BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT CALLING A DISTRICT ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF THE DISTRICT A PROPOSAL FOR THE ADOPTION OF A QUALIFIED SPECIAL TAX FOR POLICE PROTECTION, CRIME PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICES, AND TO INCREASE THE DISTRICT'S APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT.

WHEREAS, since 1948 the residents and merchants of the Broadmoor Police Protection District of San Mateo County ("District") have been provided with law enforcement and police protection services, at a level substantially above that which otherwise would not be available to them; and,

WHEREAS, since the inception of the District the residents and merchants have enjoyed a relatively crime-free community, wholly inconsistent with the surrounding area, due entirely to the enhanced law enforcement and police protection services provided by the District's police department, and that such services have since the inception of the District been funded in part by a qualified special tax; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Government Code section 50075 et. seq., this Board does hereby adopt a resolution proposing to levy a qualified special tax for police protection, crime prevention, emergency response services and any other authorized District activities; and,

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution and Government Code section 50075 et. seq. authorize the District, upon approval of two-thirds of the electorate voting on the measure, to levy a qualified special tax following notice and public hearing; and,

WHEREAS, the District presently has in place a qualified special tax imposed upon real property which will expire on June 30, 2002, and will not continue unless a new qualified special tax is adopted.

WHEREAS, since the passage of Proposition 13, the voters of the District have consistently and overwhelming cast their votes to impose a qualified special tax upon the real property situated in the District so that the residents and merchants of the District will continue to receive the enhanced law enforcement and police protection services to which they have become accustomed and which they have had in place since 1948; and,

WHEREAS, this Board has determined and declared that such a qualified special tax is necessary and vital in order for the District to remain viable and to continue to provide the special benefits of subtantially enhanced police protection, crime prevention, emergency response service and all other authorized District activities; and,

WHEREAS, this Board finds and determines that without the qualified special tax proposed by this Resolution, there will be a shortfall in revenue, and that each and every fiscal year thereafter there will be a similar shortfall in revenue to the extent that the District would not be able to remain viable unless the proposed qualified special tax is imposed.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved, ordered and declared as follows:

Section 1: Subject to voter approval this Board hereby proposes to repeal, on June 30, 2000, the existing qualified special tax provided by District Resolution No. 1996/1997-04, and adopt a new qualified special tax to go into effect on July 1, 2000, for the purpose of maintaining the District's continued viability, and to enable the District to continue to be able to provide police protection, crime prevention, emergency response services, and all other authorized District activities.

Section 2: The qualified special tax for the first year (Fiscal Year 2000/2001) shall be assessed against each parcel of real property situated entirely or partly within the District in accordance with subparagraphs (a) through (e) of this paragraph. A "parcel", for the purpose of this Resolution, is defined as any unit of land situated entirely or partly within the District which now either has a separate Assessor's Parcel Number and/or which now receives, or which will hereafter receive, a separate tax bill from the San Mateo County Tax Collector. In the event of a conflict between these two definitions, the "separate tax bill" definition shall control. All property that would otherwise be exempt from the imposition of property taxes will also be exempt from the imposition of the qualified special tax provided herein.

(a) <u>Single Family Dwellings</u>: A single family dwelling unit is a single structure unit, without any outhouse, ancillary apartment, or "in-law" unit that provides a place of abode, on a parcel of land which is used by one or more persons as the place of abode of such persons, where the use and occupancy thereof is exclusively for residential purposes. Any incidental use of such property for "in-home" businesses such as bookkeeping, seamstress, secretarial, and other such incidential home-business use shall not affect this classification. This classification also includes condominium units and cooperative units. Each condominium unit and cooperative unit shall constitute a separate assessable and taxable unit or parcel for the purposes of this special tax. Each such parcel falling within this category shall be assessed a qualified special tax of \$297.

(b) <u>Multiple Dwelling Units</u>: Multiple dwelling units are apartment houses, motels, boarding rooms, single family dwellings with any outhouse or what is commonly referred to as an "in-law" unit or units, or one or more apartment units therein or thereon, or any other structure or structures intended or used as a place of abode, whether temporary or permanent, or other structures which are entirely or substantially self-contained living units and which provide

amenities for bathing, cooking, and places to sleep, on one or more parcels of land. Each such apartment, motel room, boarding room, outhouse, "in-law", or self-contained unit shall constitute a separate assessable and taxable unit. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$297 per assessable unit.

(c) <u>Residental Board or Care Facility</u>: A residential board or care facility is any single family dwelling or multiple dwelling, on one or more parcels of land, which provides long or short term care for compensation, permanent or temporary housing of any kind. This includes rest homes, convalescent homes, and rooming houses. The assessment shall be made based upon the maximum number of beds authorized by law or by a permit issued, whether or not such beds are occupied. In cases where the maximum number of authorized beds is exceeded, the qualified special tax shall be based upon the maximum number of beds authorized plus each bed in excess of the authorized amount. In cases where no maximum number of beds is authorized, the assessment shall be based on the highest number of beds each facility had on the premises at any single time during each fiscal year. A fiscal year is defined as twelve consecutive months beginning on July 1 every year, and ending on June 30 of the year immediately following. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$249 per bed, based upon the foregoing criteria. The proper official of the District may require the operators of such facilities to execute a statement of facts under penalty of perjury material to the assessment.

(d) <u>Commercial Unit</u>: A commercial unit is a parcel of land, whether or not improved, on which is carried on a business or commercial purpose, or unimproved property situated in an area zoned or intended for commercial use, except multiple family dwellings or residential board and care units. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$645.

(e) <u>Unimproved Residential Property</u>: Unimproved residential property is a parcel of land wholly without any improvements of any kind whatsoever and situated in an area which is zoned solely for residential use. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$99.

Section 3: In connection with the proposal of the proposed qualified special tax, this Board further proposes to increase the District's appropriations limit per fiscal year, in an amount equal to the increased levy of qualified special tax for such year, as provided herein and as permitted by Article XIIIB, Section 4 of the California Constitution.

Section 4: In advance of each fiscal year, commencing Fiscal Year 2001/2002, the Board, after notice and hearing, shall annually review the qualified special tax specified in Section 2, and each subparagraph thereof, and shall continue such tax at the same rate for the next fiscal year, unless the Board determines that such tax should either be decreased or increased, in which event the Board shall fix the amount for the next fiscal year immediately following the hearing. The maximum amount of any annual increase the Board may fix shall not exceed 5% of the qualified special tax in effect at the time of the annual review.

Section 5: An election shall be and it is hereby ordered. The Board hereby requests that the San Mateo County Clerk ("County Clerk") to submit to the voters of the District on May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2000, the following ballot measure:

## BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT QUALIFIED SPECIAL TAX FOR POLICE PROTECTION, CRIME PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICES

Shall District Resolution 1999/2000-09, which would replace the present special tax on real property by a new special tax on real property, commencing July 1, 2000, at the rate specified in the Resolution and annually reviewed, for police protection and related services be approved?

Section 6: The District election shall be held and conducted, and the voters thereof canvassed, and the returns thereof be made, and the results thereof ascertained and determined as herein provided, in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Elections Code.

Section 7: All persons qualified to vote at District elections in the District, upon the date of the election herein provided for, shall be qualified to vote upon the measure submitted at the District election.

**Section 8:** The Chief of Police/District Manager is hereby instructed to cause a duly certified copy of this Resolution, which constitutes the order to hold and conduct an election and formal notice of such election, to be delivered to the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder no later than February 18, 2000.

Section 9: The Chief of Police/District Manager is authorized and fully empowered to execute an agreement, on behalf of and in the District's name, with the County of San Mateo for such necessary election services as the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder may determine pursuant to law.

Section 10: Upon voter approval of the proposed measure, the County Controller is instructed to place the qualified special tax as a charge on the tax roll commencing with the 2000-2001 fiscal year, and the San Mateo County Tax Collector is instructed to collect the qualified special tax at the same time, and subject to, the same penalties as the general ad valorem taxes

collected by the Tax Collector. The qualified special tax and penalty shall bear interest at the same rate as the rate for unpaid ad valorem property taxes until paid.

Section 11: The qualified special tax so levied shall become a lien upon the properties against which taxes are assessed and collectible, and such tax lien shall be collectible and enforceable as any other such tax lien upon or against real property.

Section 12: The collection of the qualified special tax provided for herein shall not in any way, directly or indirectly, from the effective date hereof, decrease the funds available to the District from other sources from which the District receives revenue. Nor shall the collection of such qualified special tax in any way, directly or indirectly, be used to offset or be applied as any form of credit against any funds the District is entitled to receive from all sources.

Section 13: District Resolution No. 1996/1997-04 shall be repealed effective June 30, 2000, and the qualified special tax provided by this Resolution shall go into effect on July 1, 2000, provided this Resolution is approved by the voters. In the event this Resolution and its ballot measure are not approved by the voters, District Resolution No. 1996/1997-04 shall continue in full force and effect without lapse or change until it expires by its own terms or unless it is amended or repealed by another resolution and ballot measure or as provided by law.

Section 14: The Board requests the governing body of any such other political subdivision, or any officer otherwise authorized by law, to partially or completely consolidate such election and to further provide that the canvass be made by any body or official authorized by law to canvass the returns of the election, and this Board hereby consents to such consolidation and canvass.

Section 15: The Board of Police Commissioners hereby requests that the district election be conducted as a mail ballot election as provided by, and pursuant to, the provisions of Elections Code section 4000, et seq.

Section 16: The Board of Police Commissioners hereby requests that the Office of the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar cause all notices required by law in connection herewith to be published and posted, as the case may be, in the manner prescribed by law.

Section 17: If any part, subpart, section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, paragraph, subparagraph, or provision of this Resolution is determined to be and is declared invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the reminder of this Resolution. The people of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby declare that they would have adopted this Resolution, and each part, subpart, section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, paragraph, subparagraph and provision hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more parts, subparts, sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, paragraphs, or provisions be determined and declared to be invalid.



#### § 54954.1. Mailed notice to persons who filed written request; time; duration and renewal of requests; fee

\* Any person may request that a copy of the agenda, or a copy of all the documents constituting the agenda packet, of any meeting of a legislative body \* be mailed \* to that person \* Upon receipt of the written request, the legislative body \* or its designee shall cause the requested materials to be mailed at the time the agenda is posted pursuant to Section 54954.2 and 54956 or upon distribution to all, or a majority of all, of the members of a legislative body, whichever occurs first. Any request for \* mailed copies of agendas or agenda packets shall be valid for \* the calendar year in which it is filed \* \* and must be renewed following January 1 of each year. \* The legislative body may establish a fee for mailing the agenda or agenda packet, which fee shall not exceed the cost of providing the service. Failure of \* the requesting person to receive the \* agenda or agenda packet pursuant to this section shall not constitute grounds for \* invalidation of the actions of the legislative body \* taken at the meeting for which the \* \* agenda or agenda packet was not received.

(Amended by Stats.1997, c. 253 (S.B.138), § 4.)

#### § 54954.2. Agenda; posting; action on other matters

(a) At least 72 hours before a regular meeting, the legislative body of the local agency, or its designee, shall post an agenda containing a brief general description of each item of business to be transacted or discussed at the meeting, including items to be discussed in closed session. A brief general description of an item generally need not exceed 20 words. The agenda shall specify the time and location of the regular meeting and shall be posted in a location that is freely accessible to members of the public.

No action or discussion shall be undertaken on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except that members of a legislative body or its staff may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by persons exercising their public testimony rights under Section 54964.3. In addition, on their own initiative or in response to questions posed by the public, a member of a legislative body or its staff may ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report on his or her own activities. Furthermore, a member of a legislative body, or the body itself, subject to rules or procedures of the legislative body, may provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, request staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda.

(b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), the legislative body may take action on items of business not appearing on the posted agenda under any of the conditions stated below. Prior to discussing any item pursuant to this subdivision, the legislative body shall publicly identify the item.

 Upon a determination by a majority vote of the legislative body that an emergency situation exists, as defined in Section 54956.5.

(2) Upon a determination by a two-thirds vote of the members of the legislative body present at the meeting, or, if less than two-thirds of the members are present, a unanimous vote of those members present, that there is a need to take immediate action and that the need for action came to the attention of the local agency subsequent to the agenda being posted as specified in subdivision (a).

(3) The item was posted pursuant to subdivision (a) for a prior meeting of the legislative body occurring not more than five calendar days prior to the date action is taken on the item, and at the prior meeting the item was continued to the meeting at which action is being taken.

#### § 54954.6. New or increased taxes or assessments; public meetings and public hearings; joint notice requirements

(a)(1) Before adopting any new or increased general tax or any new or increased assessment, the legislative body of a local agency shall conduct at least one public meeting at which local officials shall allow public testimony regarding the proposed new or increased general tax or new or increased assessment in addition to the noticed public hearing at which the legislative body proposes to enact or increase the general tax or assessment.

(hereinafter referred to as County Clerk);

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that the County Clerk be retained for the purpose of

conducting an election for the Broadmoor Police Protection District (hereinafter referred to as District);

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS

#### FOLLOWS:

## SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY THE BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT:

- No later than the 88th day prior to the election the District will request the Board of Supervisors through the County Clerk to conduct a mail ballot election for the Broadmoor Police Protection District on May 16, 2000, and will request services of the County Clerk.
- 2) The County Clerk will publish the Notice of Election and the Notice to File Arguments For or Against the measure.
- 3) The District will submit to the County Clerk the exact ballot wording to be voted on by the 88th day prior to the election.
- 4) The County Clerk will prepare and deliver to the printer the ballot pamphlet information containing, as applicable, ballot measure, tax rate statement, impartial analysis, arguments for or against and rebuttals thereto. The last day for primary arguments (300 words) to be submitted is February 28, 2000. The last day for rebuttal arguments (250 words) and impartial analysis is March 9, 2000.
- 5) The District will review and sign off on the sample ballot and official ballot wording for the District's Measures.

#### SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY COUNTY CLERK:

- 1) The County Clerk will select the sample and official ballot printer(s).
- 2) The County Clerk will prepare and deliver to the printer the official ballot information.
- 3) The County Clerk will issue, receive and process mail ballots.

- 4) The County Clerk will prepare a Canvass of Votes Cast and submit a Certificate of County Clerk to the District.
- 5) The County Clerk will conduct other various and miscellaneous election activities as required including but not limited to all those required of the District's Election Official, other than those described under "Services to be Performed by the Broadmoor Police Protection District".

## TERMS:

This agreement shall be in effect for the performance of all services incident to the preparation and conduct of the election to be held on May 16, 2000.

In the event the County Clerk is unable to perform services required under this Agreement, as a result of employer/employee relation conditions, vendor conditions or other conditions beyond the control of the County Clerk, the County Clerk will be relieved of all obligations under this Agreement. The County Clerk may terminate this agreement after giving 72 hours written notice and the County Clerk will be relieved of all obligations.

This agreement can be mutually terminated upon a 30 day written notice.

#### **RESOLUTION 1999/2000 - 09**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS OF THE BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT CALLING A DISTRICT ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF THE DISTRICT A PROPOSAL FOR THE ADOPTION OF A QUALIFIED SPECIAL TAX FOR POLICE PROTECTION, CRIME PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICES, AND TO INCREASE THE DISTRICT'S APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT.

WHEREAS, since 1948 the residents and merchants of the Broadmoor Police Protection District of San Mateo County ("District") have been provided with law enforcement and police protection services, at a level substantially above that which otherwise would not be available to them; and,

WHEREAS, since the inception of the District the residents and merchants have enjoyed a relatively crime-free community, wholly inconsistent with the surrounding area, due entirely to the enhanced law enforcement and police protection services provided by the District's police department, and that such services have since the inception of the District been funded in part by a qualified special tax; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Government Code section 50075 et. seq., this Board does hereby adopt a resolution proposing to levy a qualified special tax for police protection, crime prevention, emergency response services and any other authorized District activities; and,

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution and Government Code section 50075 et. seq. authorize the District, upon approval of two-thirds of the electorate voting on the measure, to levy a qualified special tax following notice and public hearing; and,

WHEREAS, the District presently has in place a qualified special tax imposed upon real property which will expire on June 30, 2002, and will not continue unless a new qualified special tax is adopted.

WHEREAS, since the passage of Proposition 13, the voters of the District have consistently and overwhelming cast their votes to impose a qualified special tax upon the real property situated in the District so that the residents and merchants of the District will continue to receive the enhanced law enforcement and police protection services to which they have become accustomed and which they have had in place since 1948; and,

WHEREAS, this Board has determined and declared that such a qualified special tax is necessary and vital in order for the District to remain viable and to continue to provide the special benefits of subtantially enhanced police protection, crime prevention, emergency response service and all other authorized District activities; and,

WHEREAS, this Board finds and determines that without the qualified special tax proposed by this Resolution, there will be a shortfall in revenue, and that each and every fiscal year thereafter there will be a similar shortfall in revenue to the extent that the District would not be able to remain viable unless the proposed qualified special tax is imposed.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved, ordered and declared as follows:

Section 1: Subject to voter approval this Board hereby proposes to repeal, on June 30, 2000, the existing qualified special tax provided by District Resolution No. 1996/1997-04, and adopt a new qualified special tax to go into effect on July 1, 2000, for the purpose of maintaining the District's continued viability, and to enable the District to continue to be able to provide police protection, crime prevention, emergency response services, and all other authorized District activities.

Section 2: The qualified special tax for the first year (Fiscal Year 2000/2001) shall be assessed against each parcel of real property situated entirely or partly within the District in accordance with subparagraphs (a) through (e) of this paragraph. A "parcel", for the purpose of this Resolution, is defined as any unit of land situated entirely or partly within the District which now either has a separate Assessor's Parcel Number and/or which now receives, or which will hereafter receive, a separate tax bill from the San Mateo County Tax Collector. In the event of a conflict between these two definitions, the "separate tax bill" definition shall control. All property that would otherwise be exempt from the imposition of property taxes will also be exempt from the imposition of the qualified special tax provided herein.

(a) <u>Single Family Dwellings</u>: A single family dwelling unit is a single structure unit, without any outhouse, ancillary apartment, or "in-law" unit that provides a place of abode, on a parcel of land which is used by one or more persons as the place of abode of such persons, where the use and occupancy thereof is exclusively for residential purposes. Any incidental use of such property for "in-home" businesses such as bookkeeping, seamstress, secretarial, and other such incidential home-business use shall not affect this classification. This classification also includes condominium units and cooperative units. Each condominium unit and cooperative unit shall constitute a separate assessable and taxable unit or parcel for the purposes of this special tax. Each such parcel falling within this category shall be assessed a qualified special tax of \$297.

(b) <u>Multiple Dwelling Units</u>: Multiple dwelling units are apartment houses, motels, boarding rooms, single family dwellings with any outhouse or what is commonly referred to as an "in-law" unit or units, or one or more apartment units therein or thereon, or any other structure or structures intended or used as a place of abode, whether temporary or permanent, or other structures which are entirely or substantially self-contained living units and which provide

amenities for bathing, cooking, and places to sleep, on one or more parcels of land. Each such apartment, motel room, boarding room, outhouse, "in-law", or self-contained unit shall constitute a separate assessable and taxable unit. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$297 per assessable unit.

(c) <u>Residental Board or Care Facility</u>: A residential board or care facility is any single family dwelling or multiple dwelling, on one or more parcels of land, which provides long or short term care for compensation, permanent or temporary housing of any kind. This includes rest homes, convalescent homes, and rooming houses. The assessment shall be made based upon the maximum number of beds authorized by law or by a permit issued, whether or not such beds are occupied. In cases where the maximum number of authorized beds is exceeded, the qualified special tax shall be based upon the maximum number of beds authorized plus each bed in excess of the authorized amount. In cases where no maximum number of beds is authorized, the assessment shall be based on the highest number of beds each facility had on the premises at any single time during each fiscal year. A fiscal year is defined as twelve consecutive months beginning on July 1 every year, and ending on June 30 of the year immediately following. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$249 per bed, based upon the foregoing criteria. The proper official of the District may require the operators of such facilities to execute a statement of facts under penalty of perjury material to the assessment.

(d) <u>Commercial Unit</u>: A commercial unit is a parcel of land, whether or not improved, on which is carried on a business or commercial purpose, or unimproved property situated in an area zoned or intended for commercial use, except multiple family dwellings or residential board and care units. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$645.

(e) <u>Unimproved Residential Property</u>: Unimproved residential property is a parcel of land wholly without any improvements of any kind whatsoever and situated in an area which is zoned solely for residential use. Each such parcel falling within this category shall pay a qualified special tax of \$99.

Section 3: In connection with the proposal of the proposed qualified special tax, this Board further proposes to increase the District's appropriations limit per fiscal year, in an amount equal to the increased levy of qualified special tax for such year, as provided herein and as permitted by Article XIIIB, Section 4 of the California Constitution.

Section 4: In advance of each fiscal year, commencing Fiscal Year 2001/2002, the Board, after notice and hearing, shall annually review the qualified special tax specified in Section 2, and each subparagraph thereof, and shall continue such tax at the same rate for the next fiscal year, unless the Board determines that such tax should either be decreased or increased, in which event the Board shall fix the amount for the next fiscal year immediately following the hearing. The maximum amount of any annual increase the Board may fix shall not exceed 5% of the qualified special tax in effect at the time of the annual review.

Section 5: An election shall be and it is hereby ordered. The Board hereby requests that the San Mateo County Clerk ("County Clerk") to submit to the voters of the District on May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2000, as Measure "A", the following ballot measure:

## BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT QUALIFIED SPECIAL TAX FOR POLICE PROTECTION, CRIME PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICES

Shall District Resolution No. 1999/2000-09 of the Broadmoor Police Protection District be approved? District Resolution No. 1999/2000-09, if approved, would repeal on June 30, 2000, District Resolution No. 1996/97-04 which currently imposes a qualified special tax on real property and would establish a new qualified special tax on real property commencing on July 1, 2000 (fiscal year 2000/2001). The new proposed qualified special tax would impose an annual tax upon: (i) each single family dwelling parcel in the amount of \$297; (ii) each multiple dwelling parcel in the amount of \$297 per dwelling unit; (iii) each resdidential care facility parcel in the amount of \$249 per bed; (iv) each commercial parcel in the amount of \$645; and, (v) each unimproved property parcel in the amount of \$99. District Resolution No. 1999/2000-09 would also require the Board of Police Commissioners to annually review the qualified special tax and to continue the existing rate, or decrease or increase such rate, after notice and hearing. The maximum amount of any annual increase the Board may set shall not exceed 5% of the qualified special tax in effect at the time of the review.

Section 6: The District election shall be held and conducted, and the voters thereof

canvassed, and the returns thereof be made, and the results thereof ascertained and determined as

herein provided, in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Elections Code.

Section 7: All persons qualified to vote at District elections in the District, upon the date of the election herein provided for, shall be qualified to vote upon the measure submitted at the District election.

**Section 8:** The Chief of Police/District Manager is hereby instructed to cause a duly certified copy of this Resolution, which constitutes the order to hold and conduct an election and formal notice of such election, to be delivered to the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder no later than February 11, 2000.

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Section 9: The Chief of Police/District Manager is authorized and fully empowered to execute an agreement, on behalf of and in the District's name, with the County of San Mateo for such necessary election services as the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder may determine pursuant to law.

Section 10: Upon voter approval of the proposed measure, the County Controller is instructed to place the qualified special tax as a charge on the tax roll commencing with the 2000-2001 fiscal year, and the San Mateo County Tax Collector is instructed to collect the qualified special tax at the same time, and subject to, the same penalties as the general ad valorem taxes collected by the Tax Collector. The qualified special tax and penalty shall bear interest at the same rate as the rate for unpaid ad valorem property taxes until paid.

Section 11: The qualified special tax so levied shall become a lien upon the properties against which taxes are assessed and collectible, and such tax lien shall be collectible and enforceable as any other such tax lien upon or against real property.

Section 12: The collection of the qualified special tax provided for herein shall not in any way, directly or indirectly, from the effective date hereof, decrease the funds available to the District from other sources from which the District receives revenue. Nor shall the collection of such qualified special tax in any way, directly or indirectly, be used to offset or be applied as any form of credit against any funds the District is entitled to receive from all sources.

Section 13: District Resolution No. 1996/1997-04 shall be repealed effective June 30, 2000, and the qualified special tax provided by this Resolution shall go into effect on July 1, 2000, provided this Resolution is approved by the voters. In the event this Resolution and its ballot measure are not approved by the voters, District Resolution No. 1996/1997-04 shall

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**RESOLUTION 1998/99-08** 

### A RESOLUTION INCREASING THE FEES AND CHARGES TO BE ASSESSED IN CONNECTION WITH D.U.I. ARRESTS AND TOWED VEHICLES

The Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby amends District Resolution 1995/96-04 as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District of the County of San Mateo finds that the district incurs costs and expenses in connection with the arrest and processing of arrested persons; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to place such financial burden, to the extent possible, upon those persons arrested for and convicted of offenses by requiring such persons to reimburse the District for costs and expenses incurred by the District in connection with such arrests;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to defray, to the extent possible, the administrative cost to the District of towing and storing or impounding motor vehicles and processing the paperwork relating to vehicles that have been towed and stored or impounded incident to an arrest by a member or employee of the District.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

SECTION 1: (a) In all cases where a person is arrested without a warrant by a District police officer for a violation of section 23152 or section 23153 of the Vehicle Code, and such person is transported to a police station, correctional facility or other place of confinement, including First Chance North, or First Chance South, and such person is convicted, whether by plea of guilty, plea of no contest or by trial, of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, as follows:

(1) For offenses occurring on and after January 1, 1988, to and including December 31, 1990, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$250.00. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1988. (2) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1991, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$300.00, plus any costs and expenses, if any, charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991.

(3) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1995, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$350.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1995.

(4) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1996, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$450.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1996.

(5) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1999, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$500.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1999.

(b) In all cases where a person is arrested, pursuant to a warrant, by a member of the Broadmoor Police Department and booked into a correctional facility or other place of confinement, and such person is convicted, whether by plea of guilty, plea of no contest or by trial, of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, the actual cost charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991.

(c) The Chief of Police shall forthwith adopt appropriate procedures for implementing this program.

(d) The foregoing provisions shall also apply to arrests in those cases where a District police officer receives an arrestee from another agency or from a private person pursuant to a private person's or citizen's arrest.

SECTION 2: In all cases where a District police officer or District employee tows and stores or impounds any motor vehicle, as required or permitted by law, such vehicle shall not be released by the facility keeping such vehicle unless and until a written form of release is issued to that facility by the Chief of Police, or by a person designated by the Chief of Police to issue such release, authorizing the facility to release the stored or towed vehicle. As a condition precedent to the issuance of such form of release, the Chief of Police or the person authorized by the Chief of Police, shall demand and collect an administrative fee therefor as follows: (a) For each Vehicle Release issued until March 31, 1996, the fee shall be \$70.00;

(b) For each release issued on and after April 1, 1996, the fee shall be \$80.00.

(c) For each release issued on and after June 1, 1999, the fee shall be \$100.00, unless the vehicle was towed pursuant to Vehicle Code §22651(h) or §22651(p), in which case the fee shall be \$125.00.

**SECTION 3:** (a) For good cause shown the Chief of Police may waive in whole or in part the assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution.

A person seeking relief in whole or in part from the (b) assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution shall file an application therefor on oath, on a form promulgated by the Chief of Police, which shall set forth the specific reasons justifying the relief requested. Such form shall be filed with the Records Clerk of the Police Department within twenty days of the date of the notice of assessment. The Chief of Police may, for good cause shown, extend the time within which to file the application for relief or permit the applicant to file his or application late, but in no event shall any extension be granted, or a late claim accepted, beyond thirty days from the date the claim should have been timely filed in the first instance. Not more than one extension of time shall be granted. Any application for relief from the assessment not timely filed or not filed in accordance with this provision shall be returned to the applicant and shall not be considered.

(c) If the applicant is dissatisfied with the decision of the Chief of Police, whether on the merits of an application for relief from the assessment or upon an application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application, such applicant may request a review <u>de novo</u> by the Board of Police Commissioners of the decision of the Chief of Police. Such request for review shall be in writing and shall be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners not later than ten days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant. No special form or technical language is required. A letter requesting review of the decision of the Chief of Police is.

(d) In the event that no request for review of the decision of the Chief of Police is filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the ten days specified in subdivision (c), the decision of the Chief of Police shall become final within the agency.

(e) For good cause shown the Board of Police Commissioners may extend the time within which to file a request for review of the Decision of the Chief of Police or grant leave to file a late request for such review. No extension of time beyond thirty days from the date the application should have been timely filed shall

be granted, and no more than one application for an extension shall be granted. An application for an extension of time or an application for leave to file a late request for review shall be made in writing on oath filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the times specified herein. An application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application for relief from the assessment must be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within thirty days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant unless the applicant has obtained an extension of time or leave has been granted to present a late application. The Board of Police Commissioners shall not grant any application for leave to file a late request for review beyond thirty days after a timely request for review should have been timely filed in the first instance.

The decision of the Board of Police Commissioners shall (1)be in writing and shall become final immediately upon rendition. The decision shall be delivered to the applicant personally, or it may be mailed to the applicant at the address shown in the application.

SECTION 4: No District police officer or District employee shall provide to any person or other entity, except allied law enforcement and other public agencies, copies of District police reports to which the person requesting such report is lawfully entitled to receive, without first demanding and collecting a fee of \$30.00 for each such report requested.

SECTION 5: No District police officer shall certify the correction of motor vehicle equipment violations specified in notices to appear issued by agencies other than the District, when such requests for certification are made at the District police station, without first demanding and collecting a fee of \$10.00 for each such certification.



DEFINITION Under supervision, to perform a variety of specialized typing, computer data entry, word processing; clerical work involving the processing, filing and maintenance of police department records, reports and documents; do related work as required.

### EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Enclosed is a copy of the application which is being filed with your agency for a determination of the member's disability, in accordance with Section 21154 and 21156, Government Code. It is required that you make this determination within six months of this request unless the local safety member waives the requirements of this provision (Government Code Section 21157).

Under the California Public Employees' Retirement Law, disability means the incapacity of a member for the performance of duty in public services for permanent or extended and uncertain duration, as determined on the basis of competent medical opinion. Disability is not necessarily an inability to perform every function of a given position. Rather, the courts have concluded that the test in any case is whether the employee can substantially perform the duties of the position he occupies. These criteria apply whether the member is being retired or is being reinstated from disability retirement.

Disputed questions regarding the industrial relationship of the disabling injury to the member's work will be resolved by the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board. In the event there is no dispute, such a finding can be made by the employer. A Workers' Compensation Award is not sufficient evidence that a local safety member is disabled for retirement purposes. There must be a specific finding under Government Code Section 21166, by the employer, with respect to the disability for which the member will be retired.

If it is determined that the member is not disabled for the performance of his or her duties, a Resolution to that effect must be filed with the System. Please refer to Sample resolution No. 1, Benefits Procedures, Procedures Manual for Public Agency reporting to the Public Employees' Retirement System. If the member is found to be disabled, the following will apply:

The Retirement System will require at least the following documentation:

1. A finding that disability exists.

PERS-BAS-175-W (3/96)

California Public Employees' Retirement System Lincoln Plaza - 400 P Street - Sacramento, CA 95814 2a. A finding by your agency as to whether or not the disability is industrial.

2b. In case of a dispute, a Findings and Award by the WCAB, resolving the industrial relationship.

3. A certified statement (Resolution) by the local agency, last day member is on payroll. In case of a dispute regarding the member's effective date of retirement, a request must be filed with the WCAB for Finding of Fact to determine on what date the member's condition became permanent and stationary. That date then becomes the effective date of retirement (Government Code Section 21164).

4. A statement identifying the type of disability retirement determined, i.e., nonindustrial disability retirement or industrial disability retirement. A member must have minimum of five years of credited service to qualify for non-industrial disability retirement. If a member does not meet the minimum service requirements for disability retirement, he may still qualify by re-depositing previously withdrawn contributions, or contributing an amount for service rendered prior to membership with the System. Time during which the member is absent from State service by reason of injury or illness, which is determined within one year after the end of such absence to be job-related, shall be considered as time spent in State service for the purpose of qualification for retirement and death benefits.

5. A statement by the agency to the effect that there is, or is not, a possibility of third-party liability present, if member's disability was caused by negligence or an intentional act of a party other than employer.

6. A statement identifying the reason for the disability, i.e. orthopedic, psychological, cardio-vascular, internal, neurological or other.

7. If advance disability pension payments will be paid to the member, include the monthly amount. Also include where the reimbursement check should be mailed.

8. If the employee was hired after 1/1/80, include the following in accordance with Government Code Section 21417:

a. Was the disability the result of an injury which was a direct consequence of a violent act perpetrated upon his or her person?

b. Did the disability occur during the performance of those portions of his or her duties which are particularly hazardous and dangerous?

(For the <u>particularly</u> hazardous and dangerous exception to apply the disability must have occurred during the performance of job duties which had an <u>especially</u> high risk of danger when compared to other duties which were performed. It is not sufficient that the

overall job duties were hazardous or dangerous to some degree; the exception pertains to hazards or dangers which stand above or apart from the expected hazards of the job. This exception does not apply simply because a member has an inherently hazardous and dangerous job.)

All such documentation submitted by your agency must be signed by the governing body or its lawful delegate (City Manager, Chief Administrative Officer, County Executive, or other comparable individual). If the governing body chooses to delegate the responsibility of making a determination, a certified copy of the delegation order of this authority must accompany the finding by such delegate in each instance.

Under the law, if a person (other than the employer) caused an injury that results in certain CaIPERS benefits being paid, then CaIPERS has the right to recover from the responsible person up to one-half of the total retirement benefit costs payable due to this injury. This right is known as a "right of subrogation". (Government Code section 20250 et seq.) Accordingly, the Retirement System request that you, as the local agency, send us copies of all injury reports sent to the State Compensation Insurance fund (or your Workers' Compensation carrier) concerning any and all injuries sustained by this employee.

Please advise us if you are aware our member is pursuing a claim (other than a Workers' Compensation claim) against any person or entity for the same injuries that also entitle the member to a disability retirement from CalPERS.

WHEREAS, certain special districts have heretofore entered into a joint exercise of powers agreement pursuant to the JPA Law (the "Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement") under which the Special District Risk Management Authority (the "Authority") has been created to, among other things, establish pools for self-insured losses and purchasing excess insurance and administrative services in connection with joint protection programs;

WHEREAS, the Broadmoor Police Protection District is a member of the Authority, has executed the most current Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement and participates in at least one joint protection program;

WHEREAS, the Authority offers a Workers' Compensation coverage program to its members; and

WHEREAS, the Broadmoor Police Protection District wishes to participate in the Workers' Compensation Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. <u>Declaration of the Board of Police Commissioners</u>. This District Board of Police Commissioners hereby specifically finds and declares that the actions authorized hereby constitute and are with respect to public affairs of the District, and that the statements, findings

and determinations of the District set forth in the preambles above and of the documents approved herein are true and correct.

WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District of the County of San Mateo finds that the district incurs costs and expenses in connection with the arrest and processing of arrested persons; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to place such financial burden, to the extent possible, upon those persons arrested for and convicted of offenses by requiring such persons to reimburse the District for costs and expenses incurred by the District in connection with such arrests;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the District to defray, to the extent possible, the administrative cost to the District of towing and storing or impounding motor vehicles and processing the paperwork relating to vehicles that have been towed and stored or impounded incident to an arrest by a member or employee of the District.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

**SECTION 1:** (a) In all cases where a person is arrested without a warrant by a District police officer for a violation of section 23152 or section 23153 of the Vehicle Code, and such person is transported to a police station, correctional facility or other place of confinement, including First Chance North, or First Chance South, and such person is convicted, whether by plea of guilty, plea of no contest or by trial, of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, as follows:

(1) For offenses occurring on and after January 1, 1988, to and including December 31, 1990, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$250.00. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1988. (2) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1991, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$300.00, plus any costs and expenses, if any, charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991.

(3) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1995, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$350.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1995.

(4) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1996, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$450.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1996.

(5) For offenses occurring from and after January 1, 1999, the person shall be assessed the sum of \$500.00, plus any fees charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1999.

(b) In all cases where a person is arrested, pursuant to a warrant, by a member of the Broadmoor Police Department and booked into a correctional facility or other place of confinement, and such person is convicted, whether by plea of guilty, plea of no contest or by trial, of any offense as a result of that arrest, such person shall be assessed, and he or she shall reimburse the District, the actual cost charged to the District by the correctional facility or other place of confinement. This provision shall apply retrospectively to January 1, 1991.

(c) The Chief of Police shall forthwith adopt appropriate procedures for implementing this program.

(d) The foregoing provisions shall also apply to arrests in those cases where a District police officer receives an arrestee from another agency or from a private person pursuant to a private person's or citizen's arrest.

**SECTION 2:** In all cases where a District police officer or District employee tows and stores or impounds any motor vehicle, as required or permitted by law, such vehicle shall not be released by the facility keeping such vehicle unless and until a written form of release is issued to that facility by the Chief of Police, or by a person designated by the Chief of Police to issue such release, authorizing the facility to release the stored or towed vehicle. As a condition precedent to the issuance of such form of release, the Chief of Police or the person authorized by the Chief of Police, shall demand and collect an administrative fee therefor as follows: (a) For each Vehicle Release issued until March 31, 1996, the fee shall be \$70.00;

(b) For each release issued on and after April 1, 1996, the fee shall be \$80.00.

(c) For each release issued on and after June 1, 1999, the fee shall be \$100.00, unless the vehicle was towed pursuant to Vehicle Code §22651(h) or §22651(p), in which case the fee shall be \$125.00.

(d) For each release issued on and after June 1, 1999, the fee shall be \$100.00, unless the vehicle was towed pursuant to Vehicle Code §22651(h) or §22651(p), in which case the fee shall be \$150.00.

**SECTION 3:** (a) For good cause shown the Chief of Police may waive in whole or in part the assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution.

(b) A person seeking relief in whole or in part from the assessment under Section 1 of this Resolution shall file an application therefor on oath, on a form promulgated by the Chief of Police, which shall set forth the specific reasons justifying the relief requested. Such form shall be filed with the Records Clerk of the Police Department within twenty days of the date of the notice of assessment. The Chief of Police may, for good cause shown, extend the time within which to file the application for relief or permit the applicant to file his or application late, but in no event shall any extension be granted, or a late claim accepted, beyond thirty days from the date the claim should have been timely filed in the first instance. Not more than one extension of time shall be granted. Any application for relief from the assessment not timely filed or not filed in accordance with this provision shall be returned to the applicant and shall not be considered.

(c) If the applicant is dissatisfied with the decision of the Chief of Police, whether on the merits of an application for relief from the assessment or upon an application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application, such applicant may request a review <u>de novo</u> by the Board of Police Commissioners of the decision of the Chief of Police. Such request for review shall be in writing and shall be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners not later than ten days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant. No special form or technical language is required. A letter requesting review of the decision of the Chief of Police is.

(d) In the event that no request for review of the decision of the Chief of Police is filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the ten days specified in subdivision (c), the decision of the Chief of Police shall become final within the agency.

(e) For good cause shown the Board of Police Commissioners may extend the time within which to file a request for review of the Decision of the Chief of Police or grant leave to file a late request for such review. No extension of time beyond thirty days from the date the application should have been timely filed shall be granted, and no more than one application for an extension shall be granted. An application for an extension of time or an application for leave to file a late request for review shall be made in writing on oath filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within the times specified herein. An application for an extension of time or for leave to present a late application for relief from the assessment must be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners within thirty days from the date the decision of the Chief of Police is delivered personally or by mail to the applicant unless the applicant has obtained an extension of time or leave has been granted to present a late application. The Board of Police Commissioners shall not grant any application for leave to file a late request for review beyond thirty days after a timely request for review should have been timely filed in the first instance.

The decision of the Board of Police Commissioners shall (1)be in writing and shall become final immediately upon rendition. The decision shall be delivered to the applicant personally, or it may be mailed to the applicant at the address shown in the application.

SECTION 4: No District police officer or District employee shall provide to any person or other entity, except allied law enforcement and other public agencies, copies of District police reports to which the person requesting such report is lawfully entitled to receive, without first demanding and collecting a fee of \$30.00 for each such report requested.

SECTION 5: No District police officer shall certify the correction of motor vehicle equipment violations specified in notices to appear issued by agencies other than the District, when such requests for certification are made at the District police station, without first demanding and collecting a fee of \$10.00 for each such certification.

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# BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS OF THE BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT

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Resolution No. 2002/2003 – 09 [Amended] A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING CLASSES OF SERVICE OF DISTRICT EMPLOYEEES

WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners has determined that it is in the best interest of the District and its employees that such employees' employment with the District fall into a classification, and that classes of service for such employees will provide the District and its employees with definite and specific guidelines, rights and duties not inconsistent with, contrary to, or prohibited by, the laws and constitution of the United States and the laws and constitution of the State of California.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that effective June 1, 2003, all employment with the District, except as otherwise provided by Resolution of this Board, shall be classified as follows:

#### 1. NON-CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYMENT:

Employment with the District is non-civil service and shall not be governed by, or subject to, any civil service law, ordinance, rule, or regulation of any kind. All employment with the District shall be governed exclusively by this Resolution, subject to, and not inconsistent with, the laws and constitution of the United States, and the laws and constitution of the State of California

2. <u>CLASSES OF EMPLOYMENT</u>:

(a) <u>Class I Service</u>:

(i) Class I service shall consist of only those public safety employees who are employed on a full-time permanent basis as peace officers whose sole or primary occupation is such employment.

(ii) Class I employees shall be tenured, except the Chief of Police, Commander of Police, and those Class I employees who are on probation. Probationary Class I employees shall not become tenured until they successfully complete the period of probation of not less than eighteen months from the date of their appointment, or such longer period of time the Chief of Police may without cause, prior to the expiration of probation, establish for such employee.

(iii) The Chief of Police shall be appointed by a majority vote of the Police Commission and may be removed from office without cause by a majority vote of the Police Commission. In the event of the removal of the Chief of Police, he or she shall, at his or her request, be restored to his or her last full-time, tenured position, if any, with the District, without loss of seniority with respect to date-of-hire.

(iv) The Commander of Police shall be appointed by the Chief of Police, subject to the approval of a majority vote of the Police Commission, and may be removed by the Chief of Police without cause and without the approval of the Police Commission. In the event of the removal of the Commander of Police, he or she shall, at his or her request, be restored to his or her last full-time, tenured position, if any, with the District, without loss of seniority with respect to date-of-hire.

# (b) <u>Class II Service</u>:

Class II service shall consist of all public safety employees employed as peace officers except those employees who fall within Class I service. Class II employees shall include all employees hired pursuant to a grant, employees hired for s specific duration, volunteer members, employees pursuant to a contract of employment, and part-time employees, none of whom shall be tenured or be deemed tenured.

# (c) <u>Class III Service</u>:

Class III service shall consist of all non-public safety employees employed in all non-peace officer capacities on a full-time or part-time basis. Full-time Class III employees shall be tenured upon the satisfactory completion of their probationary period, which shall be not less than eighteen months from the date of appointment, or such longer period of time the Chief of Police may without cause, prior to the expiration of probation, establish for such employee.

# 3. <u>CLASS I PROBATION AND P.O.S.T. BASIC CERTIFICATE</u>:

# (a) <u>Class I Employees</u>:

Class I employees shall be on probation for a period of eighteen months from the date of appointment, unless such period is extended by the Chief of Police prior to the expiration thereof. The Chief of Police may without cause extend the period of probation prior to the expiration thereof. The Chief of Police may reinstate a non-probationary employee to a period of probation only with just cause and in accordance with the laws of the State of California and the agreement between the employee's bargaining unit and the District, to the extend such agreement provides therefore.

(b) <u>Class II Employees</u>:

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Class II employees, who are employed for compensation on full-time basis or on a part time basis of at least twenty hours per week, on a grant, or as a contract employee for either a specified or indefinite term, or who, either at the time of appointment or at any time thereafter, possess a certificate of completion of the Basic Course from a P.O.S.T. accredited Police Academy, and who would be eligible to receive a P.O.S.T. Basic Certificate upon satisfactory completion of probation if such Class II employee were a Class I employee, shall be eligible to apply for such Basic Certificate so long as such employee satisfactorily performs his or her service for the same eighteen month probationary period of time required of a Class I employee, either from the date of appointment, if such employee has satisfactorily completed a Basic Academy at the time of appointment, or after the date appointment but from the date the employee satisfactorily completes a Basic Academy, in which event the Class II employee may apply for his or her P.O.S.T. Basic Certificate, although such employee shall remain a Class II employee for all purposes.

# 4. <u>DISMISSAL</u>:

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The Chief of Police may at any time and without cause release, dismiss, or discharge any employee, except a Class I employee or a Class III employee who is no longer on probation, from service with the District.

# 5. <u>SERVICE CLASSIFICATION</u>:

The class of each employee's service shall in a writing signed by the employee and the Chief of Police.

# 3. <u>CHANGE OF CLASSIFICATION</u>:

An employee's classification may be changed only in writing signed by the employee and the Chief of Police.

# 4. <u>COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS</u>:

The rate of compensation and benefits to the employees shall be fixed as follows:

(a) The rate of compensation and benefits of Class I employees shall be fixed by written agreement between the employee and the District if such employee is not represented by and a member of a bargaining unit. (b) The rate of compensation and benefits of Class I employees who are represented by a bargaining unit shall be by written agreement between the District and the designated representative of the employee's bargaining unit.

(c) The rate of compensation of Class II employees shall be fixed by written agreement between the employee and the Chief of Police. Class II employees shall not be eligible for or receive any benefits not specifically required by law, including, but without limitation to, vacation pay, sick pay, pension or retirement benefits, and medical and dental coverage, beyond the compensation agreed upon, except those benefits specifically enumerated in writing and signed by the employee and Chief of Police.

(d) The term "benefits" includes all of those benefits not specifically required by law that are set forth in the memorandum of understanding or contract between the District and the employees' bargaining unit, which from time to time may change.

5. <u>CONSTRUCTION</u>:

(a) Nothing contained in this Resolution is intended to modify, alter, change, or in any way interfere with the employees' rights and entitlements afforded such employee by law and/or by the agreement between the District and the employees' bargaining unit. (b) Nothing contained in this Resolution is intended to limit or restrict the existing authority of the Chief of Police to impose discipline upon an employee.

- 1. That the Board of Police Commissioners hereby appoints Commissioner Joseph P. Sheridan to represent the Broadmoor Police Commission during the meetings relative to the countywide selection process for Independent Special District representatives to the Local Agency Formation Commission.
- 2. That the Board of Police Commissioners hereby grants full authority to Commissioner Sheridan to act on behalf of the entire Board of Police Commissioners in voting and or other decision making issues relative to the representative selection process.
- 3. That a copy of this Resolution be provided at the time of the next Independent Special Districts Selection Committee meeting.





# SUBJECT: TAX DEFERRED MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS AND REVENUE RULING 2006-43

As noted in Circular Letter 200-049-08 dated October 3, 2008, the Internal Revenue Service has issued Revenue Ruling 2006-43 concerning the "pick-up" of employee contributions, and actions that an employer may be required to take before December 31, 2008 to ensure compliance with "pick-up" requirements. You are receiving this additional letter because our payroll records indicate that your payroll includes taxdeferred member contributions ("pick-ups"), but we do not have a copy of the "pick-up" resolution in our files.

CalPERS is taking steps to ensure that contracting agency and school employers adopt and submit appropriate written documentation of "pick-ups" prior to reporting taxdeferred employee contributions to CalPERS.

In addition, CalPERS is in the process of building and installing a new business reporting system and we are seeking to obtain up to date information about contracting agency and school employer "pick-ups". As a way of ensuring that our system will accurately record your agency's "pick-up" resolution and to ensure ongoing compliance with CalPERS' regulations and federal tax reporting requirements, we request that you review your files for documentary evidence authorizing employer "pick-up" of employee contributions. The new system will validate that you have documentation on file with CalPERS before accepting tax-deferred member contributions. If documentation is not on file, your records will be rejected and will be held until the appropriate documentation is received. If you do not have documentary evidence of the authorization for employer "pick-ups", we request that you take steps to have your governing board adopt an appropriate resolution by December 31, 2008. That the amount of the contributions designated as employee contributions and paid by the Broadmoor Police Protection District to the Public Employees' Retirement System on behalf of an employee shall be the entire contribution required of the employee by the Public Employees' Retirement Law (California Government Code sections 20000, et seq.).

That the contributions designated as employee contributions made by Broadmoor Police Protection District to the Public Employees' Retirement System shall be treated for all purposes, other than taxation, in the same way that member contributions are treated by the Public Employees' Retirement System.

- (a) Recordings of telephone and radio communications over one hundred and eighty (180) days old, providing such recordings are not evidence in any claim filed or any pending litigation (or potential claims and litigation), in which case such recordings shall be preserved for one hundred (100) days after the conclusion of litigation.
- (b) Auction receipts and records over two (2) years old.
- (c) Records of expired licenses and permits over two (2) years old.
- (d) Records of lost and found items, which lost and found items have been lawfully disposed of, over two (2) years old.
- (e) Miscellaneous non-criminal reports over two (2) years old.
- (f) Police Department daily activity records and logs over two (2) years old.

- (g) All crime and supplemental reports of infractions, misdemeanors and felonies over three (3) years old, providing:
  - (1) They do not relate to an unadjudicated arrest, except for section 2, below.
  - (2) They do not relate to unserved warrants.
  - (3) They do not involve identifiable items which have not been recovered.
  - (4) They do not relate to Penal Code Section 290 or 457.1, or Health and Safety Code Section 11590 registrants.
  - (5) They do not relate to a criminal death case.
  - (6) They do not relate to violations listed in Penal Code Sections 799 and 800.
  - (7) The cases are not presently involved in either civil or criminal litigation.
- (h) All index cards and logs which relate to the case documents destroyed.
- (i) Field interview cards over two (2) years old.
  - (j) Duplicates of all reports, when the duplicates are no longer needed.

2. Records pertaining to the arrest or conviction of any person for a violation of subdivision (b), (c), (d), or (e) of Section 11357 or subdivision (b) of Section 11360 of the Health and Safety Code occurring after January 1, 1976 shall not be kept beyond two years from the date of conviction, or from the date of arrest if there was no conviction.

3. Any documents relating to citizen complaints or investigations in response to citizen complaints relating to members of the Police Department and internal affairs investigation files shall be retained for a period of at least five (5) years, providing such documents are not evidence in any claim filed or any pending litigation (or potential litigation), in which case such documents shall be preserved for five (5) years after the conclusion of litigation.

4. This Resolution also authorizes the Police Department to purge arrest warrants according to a recall schedule established by the Courts for the timely return of warrants.

#### AGREEMENT FOR COMPENSATION TO COUNTY OF SAN MATEO FOR COLLECTION OF SPECIAL TAX CHARGES

THIS AGREEMENT, is entered into this 23 day of June , 2009, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called "County," and BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT

### $\underline{WITNESSETH}$ :

WHEREAS, as a service to cities and special districts, the County collects certain special taxes through the countywide property tax bill and, in exchange for collecting such special taxes, the County is compensated pursuant to agreements with each of the affected cities and special districts; and

WHEREAS, such compensation agreement were initially executed by and between the County and BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT in or about the Fiscal Year 1980-81 (the "Initial Agreement") and the compensation rates therein were not revisited until the Fiscal Year 2003-04 when the initial agreement was amended (the "2003 Amended Agreement"); and

RESOLVED, by the Broadmoor Police Commission of the Broadmoor Police

Protection District, State of California, that

WHEREAS, in 2014 the California Legislature and Governor approved

Assembly Bill 2028 (AB 2028), which is a pilot program permitting certain elections in

San Mateo County to be conducted wholly by mail if specific conditions are met; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to AB 2028, each jurisdiction may determine whether to participate in this pilot program and whether to authorize its election on a given date to be conducted by mail, provided, however, that election in question shall not be

conducted by mail pursuant to the pilot program unless all overlapping jurisdictions with

Arthur Stellini Chief of Police elections on that same date so request; and

WHEREAS, if the election is authorized by all affected jurisdictions to be conducted pursuant to the AB 2028 pilot program, various actions shall be taken to ensure that voter access and turnout is protected, including but not limited to the following:

- At least one ballot dropoff location shall be provided in each city;
- A ballot dropoff location shall be open during business hours to receive ballots beginning 28 days prior to the election through 8 p.m. on the night of the election;
- At least one polling place shall be provided per city between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. on election day for voters to request a ballot who did not receive a ballot or who need a replacement ballot for any reason;
- At the request of any city, county, or district, the Chief Elections Officer may provide additional ballot dropoff locations and polling places;
- All elections materials, including a prepaid return envelope for the ballot, shall be provided to each voter;
- A list of ballot dropoff locations and polling places shall be delivered to each voter; and
- Polling places shall be located at an accessible location and equipped with voting machines that are accessible to individuals with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, in general, the cost of conducting an election pursuant to the pilot program described above is expected to be significantly less overall than a typical election, and this cost reduction should translate to lower costs to each jurisdiction that participates in the pilot program election compared to the typical election costs borne by each jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the San Mateo County Chief Elections Officer has reported that in San Mateo County, 57% of registered voters are permanently registered to vote by mail, in the November 2013 Consolidated Municipal, School, and Special District Election over 76% of the ballots were cast by mail, and in the June 2014 Primary Election over 77% of the ballots were cast by mail; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Elections Officer has stated an intention to have the November 3, 2015 Consolidated Municipal, School, and Special District Election be the first mail election conducted pursuant to the AB 2028 pilot program in San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, this Broadmoor Police Commission has considered the merits of the proposed pilot election program and desires to participate in the pilot program given the protections for voter access and participation in the election and anticipated cost savings to the Broadmoor Police Protection District. NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Broadmoor Police Protection District Broadmoor Police Commission authorizes the November 3, 2015 election for the Broadmoor Police Protection District to be conducted wholly by mailed ballots pursuant to AB 2028 and consolidated with all other elections occurring on that date within San Mateo County. Accordingly, the San Mateo County Chief Elections Officer is requested to conduct the November 3, 2015 election for Broadmoor Police Protection District, including any elections for officials of Broadmoor Police Protection District and measures relating to Broadmoor Police Protection District, as an election conducted wholly by mail pursuant to the AB 2028 pilot program, it being understood that the election shall occur wholly by mail on that date only if all overlapping jurisdictions with elections on that date make the same request. If all overlapping jurisdictions with elections on that date do not so request, the Broadmoor Police Protection District election shall occur as normal on that date pursuant to the other provisions of the Elections Code.

**BE IT ADDITIONALLY RESOLVED** that the Clerk of the Broadmoor Police Protection District Broadmoor Police Commission is hereby directed to notify the Secretary of State no later than August 6, 2015, of the Broadmoor Police Protection District's intent to conduct an all-mailed ballot election as outlined above.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Broadmoor Police Protection District Broadmoor Police Commission shall separately send information regarding the specifics of its November 3, 2015 election to the San Mateo County Chief Elections Officer.

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE POLICE COMMISSION OF BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT DETERMINING THAT POLICE CORPORAL REY PAGARIGAN IS DISABLED AND ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE AN INDUSTRIAL DISABILITY RETIREMENT (GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 21156)

WHEREAS, the Broadmoor Police Protection District (hereinafter referred to as "District") is a contracting agency of the California Public Employees' Retirement System ("CalPERS");

WHEREAS, the California Public Employees' Retirement Law requires that a contracting agency determine whether an employee of such agency in employment in which he is classified as a local safety member is disabled for purposes of the California Public Employees' Retirement Law and whether such disability is "industrial" within the meaning of such law;

WHEREAS, Rey Pagarigan was a former employee of the District and held the position of Police Officer (Corporal);

WHEREAS, an application for industrial disability retirement of Rey Pagarigan has been filed with the CalPERS; and

WHEREAS, the Police Commission, as the governing body of the District, has reviewed the available medical and other evidence relevant to such alleged disability.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLICE COMMISSION OF THE BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Police Commission of the District does hereby find and determine that Rey Pagarigan is incapacitated within the meaning of the California Public Employees' Retirement Law for performance of his duties in the position of Police Officer (Corporal), and does hereby certify under penalty of perjury that this determination was made on the basis of competent medical opinion and was not used as a substitute for the disciplinary process in accordance with Government Code section 21156(a)(2). If the disciplinary process occurred before the member's separation from employment, all relevant personnel documents were forwarded to CalPERS for determination of the member's eligibility for disability retirement and CalPERS' determination that the member is eligible to apply for disability retirement was obtained prior to starting the process of determination;

 Rey Pagarigan had filed a Workers' Compensation claim(s) for his disabling condition(s). The Workers' Compensation claim(s) was accepted.

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE Police Commission of the District does hereby find and determine that such disability is the result of injury or disease arising out of and in the course of employment.

4. Neither Rey Pagarigan nor the District has applied to the Workers Compensation Appeals Board for a determination pursuant to Government Code Section 21166 as to whether such disability is industrial.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Rey Pagarigan was separated from his 5. employment in the position of Police Officer (Corporal) after expiration of his rights under Government Code Section 21164, effective April 5, 2018, and that no dispute as to the expiration of such leave rights is pending. His last day on paid status was April 4, 2018.

6. There is not a possibility of third party liability.

7. Advanced Disability Pension Payments will be made. On May 25, 2018, the District will pay Rey Pagarigan an ADPP payment in the amount of \$6,800.22 for the period April 5, 2018 through May 19, 2018. Thereafter, ADPP payments will be made bi-weekly in the amount of \$1,942.92 beginning June 8, 2018. Such payments will continue only until CalPERS notifies the Parties that it has accepted the District's determination on Rey Pagarigan's disability retirement application and/or that CalPERS will make disability pension payments to Rey Pagarigan.

8. The primary disabling condition is heart disease.

9. The duration of the disabling condition is expected to be permanent or last at least twelve consecutive months from the date of the application for benefit or will result in death, which is certified by competent medical opinion, as determined on the basis of competent medical opinion.

WHEREAS, California Elections Code Section 1001 provides that elections held in June and November of each even-numbered years are statewide elections and the dates of those elections are statewide election dates; and

WHEREAS, the terms of two members of the Police Commission are set to expire in November 2017 and the term of one member of the Police Commission is set to expire in November 2019; and

WHEREAS, the next statewide general election in November of an evennumbered year at which the members of the Board of Police Commissioners could be elected following the expiration of the terms of the current Commissioners is November 6, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners desires, as permitted by law, to consolidate the election of members of its Board of Police Commissioners with the statewide general election held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to its rights, powers and authority, the Board of Police Commissioners of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby:

- Orders the elections of its members of the District's Board of Police Commissioners to occur regularly on the same date as statewide general elections occurring on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years and to be consolidated with those even-numbered year elections.
- Orders such elections commence with the statewide general election to be held on November 6, 2018.

Acknowledges that those members of the Board of Police Commission whose terms of office will expire prior to the statewide general election in November 2018 will continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified in accordance with Section 10404(i) of the California Elections Code at the November 2018 election, and that member of the Board of Police Commission whose terms of office will expire in December 2019 will continue in office until their successors are elected and qualified in at the November 2020 election.
- Directs the Commission's Secretary to submit this resolution to the County of San Mateo Board of Supervisors no later than 240 days prior to the next scheduled District Election.
- Requests the County of San Mateo Board of Supervisors administer this Resolution as set forth in Section 10404 of the California Elections Code and, within 60 days of the submission of this Resolution, approve this Resolution unless it finds that the ballot style, voting equipment, or computer capacity cannot handle additional elections or materials, in accordance with Section 10404(e) of the California Elections Code.

*(If by district)* Each governing board member shall reside in the sub district area where she or he seeks to represent and shall be elected by <u>the registered voters</u> of the entire jurisdiction (at-large) or the registered voters of that particular sub <u>district area (by district)</u> (*choose one*).

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code 10509, not less than 125 days prior to the date of the election, the jurisdiction secretary shall deliver a notice to the Chief Elections Officer. The notice shall bear the secretary's signature and the district seal and shall also contain both of the following:

(a) The elective offices of the jurisdiction to be filled at the next general district election, specifying which offices, if any, are for the balance of an unexpired term.

(b) Whether the jurisdiction or the candidate is to pay for the publication of a candidate statement.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code 10522, not less than 125 days prior to the date of the election, the Broadmoor Police Protection District shall deliver to the Chief Elections Officer a map showing the boundaries of the jurisdiction and the boundaries of the divisions of the jurisdiction, if any, within the County and a statement indicating in which divisions a member of the Board of Police Commissioners is to be elected and whether any elective officer is to be elected at large at the next general district election.

WHEREAS, the Special District Manager of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby is authorized and directed to enter an Elections Service Agreement with the Chief Elections Officer regarding the election to be held on **November 3rd, 2020** to outline the detailed services to be provided by both the Broadmoor Police Protection District and the Chief Elections Officer.

WHEREAS, the Chief Elections Officer shall send an itemized invoice to the Broadmoor Police Protection District for all services provided pursuant to the Elections Service Agreement after the election is conducted and all related costs are determined. The Broadmoor Police Protection District agrees to submit payment on the full amount of the invoice to the County of San Mateo within forty-five (45) days of the date of the invoice.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that pursuant to Elections Code 13307, each candidate for the Board of Police Commissioners to be voted in the election to be held on **November 3rd, 2020** may prepare a candidate statement on the appropriate form provided by the Chief Elections Officer. Such statement shall be limited to 200 words. The prorated costs of printing, mailing and translating the statements shall be paid by the candidate.

Whereas, the District has taken steps to comply with CCR 570.5 by posting department budgets for the last five years including the Districts current MOA dated June 01, 2015 through May 31, 2019 (including increased pay scale exhibits for every year of the MOA) on the Districts website. Additionally, we have posted minutes from the public commission hearings on these matters;

**WHEREAS**, the Police Commission, as the governing body of the District, has reviewed the available  $r_{\text{C}}$  ords and other supporting documentation relevant to Chief Stellini's pay scale history;

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLICE COMMISSION OF THE BROADMOOR POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

- The Chief's position is not included in the MOA, though the position pay scale is noted on the yearly budget reports. Over the last three pay increases, the Chiefs position shows an yearly increase of \$150,000.00 to \$165,000.00. These pay increases, all mistakenly reflected, having the identical monthly pay scale of \$12,500.00
- 2. The below chart, is an accurate reflection of Chief Stellini's pay scale history over the last 36 plus months.

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## EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT WITH CHIEF OF POLICE AND DISTRICT MANAGER

This Employment Agreement with Chief of Police and District Manager ("Agreement") is effective December 14, 2021 between the Broadmoor Police Protection District, a California special district ("District") and Mark Melville ("Employee"), who agree as follows:

#### 1. Recitals

1.1. District is a police protection district formed and existing under Health and Safety Code section 20000, et. seq. for the purpose of providing police protection services to the unincorporated area of Broadmoor;

1.2. Existing law provides that the District, its police department, the chief of police, and all employees shall have all rights, duties, privileges, immunities, obligations, and powers of a municipal police department.

1.3. District is governed by a Board of Commissioners ("Board"), who are authorized to appoint and enter into a contract for employment for the District's Chief of Police and District Manager.

1.4. District and Employee agree to employ Employee on a temporary basis, on and subject to the terms set forth in this Agreement.

#### 2. Employment

2.1. District employs Employee as the Chief of Police and District Manager ("Chief of Police") to perform the duties and functions of the Chief of Police and District Manager as specified in section 4 of this Agreement, on and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Employee hereby accepts such employment on and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

2.2. Employee's employment as Chief of Police and District Manager is temporary and at-will, and he serves at the pleasure of the Board. At-will employment means that the employment is pleasure of the District, and either party may terminate the employment at any time, for any reason, or no reason at all.

2.3. Employee's employment shall additionally be subject to the terms and conditions of the Broadmoor Police Policy Manual ("Policy Manual"), including all terms specific to the Chief of Police's employment and responsibilities for District administration, and any and all District personnel policies and procedures.

2.4. As a condition to employment under this Agreement, Employee shall be required to be reinstated from CalPERS retirement on or before the day he reports to work as Chief of Police.

#### 3. Term

This Agreement will commence on the effective date stated above and remain in effect until terminated as provided in section 8.

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#### 4. Duties

Employee's duties under this Agreement are those duties and responsibilities assigned to the office of Chief of Police and District Manager as described in the job description for the District Chief Executive Officer position as adopted and amended from time to time by the Board of Commissioners, the duties and responsibilities for the Chief of Police and District Manager as provided in the Policy Manual, and such other duties and responsibilities as required by law or as assigned by the Board of Commissioners.

#### 5. Work Hours

5.1. Employee will devote his full time, attention and energies to his duties and will be available to work at such times as necessary to fully and competently perform the duties assigned, regardless of the number of hours involved. Employee acknowledges that the duties of his position may require an average of more than 40 hours per week, and that some day-to-day hours may vary significantly. Employee's compensation (whether salary or benefits or other allowances) is not based on hours worked. Employee will not be entitled to, nor shall receive, any compensation for overtime hours worked or otherwise earn or be entitled to compensatory time off for hours worked in excess of eight per day or 40 per week, because the Chief of Police and District Manager job classification is and "exempt" classification and is not subject to the overtime provisions of the federal Fair Labor Standards Act ("FLSA").

5.2. During the term of this Agreement, Employee shall be exclusively employed by the District, unless prior written authorization otherwise is received from the Board of Commissioners.

5.3. District and Employee will confer and agree on Employee's exact report to work date, but in no event shall Employee's report to work date be later than January 1, 2022.

#### 6. Salary and Benefits

For all services to be rendered by Employee under this Agreement, District will provide to Employee the following salary and benefits:

6.1. Employee will be paid a monthly salary of \$13,333.00.

6.2. Participation in District's group medical, dental and vision plans that are offered to all public safety officers employed by the District. District will pay the full cost of the coverage for Employee and Employee's dependents.

6.3. Subject to eligibility, participation in the appropriate CalPERS pension plan, as determined by CalPERS, in accordance with District's contract with CalPERS. Employee will pay the required employee contribution to CalPERS based on CalPERS' determination of his status as a classic member or new member. District will pay the employer share.

6.4. Vacation leave with pay in the amount of 160 hours per year.

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6.5. Sick leave with pay at the accrual rate currently afforded to all public safety officers employed by the District, as specified in the District Sick Leave Policy No. 1005.

6.6. District shall assign to Employee a District vehicle, pursuant to the terms and conditions of District Policy No. 703, as contained in the Police Policy Manual.

6.7. Reimbursement of reasonable expenses, including but not limited to business telephone calls, lodging, meals, air travel fares, parking fees, business meals, professional organization membership dues, cellular telephone service, and other official District-related expenses incurred on behalf of District, as reviewed and approved before payment by the Board of Commissioners.

6.8. In addition to any specific benefits described in this Agreement, Employee is eligible for all employment benefits as offered to all public safety officers employed by the District. If any term or condition is inconsistent with a term or condition of the Policy Manual or any other District policy or procedure, the provisions of this Agreement will govern. The District reserves the right to eliminate or modify any of its benefits at any time; provided that any specific benefit provided by his Agreement may not be changed except by a written amendment negotiated between District and Employee in accordance with section 15 of this Agreement.

#### 7. Performance Evaluations

The District, in coordination with Employee, shall undertake a performance evaluation process which is intended to provide review and feedback to Employee so as to facilitate the effective management of the District. As part of this process, Employee shall submit to the Board of Commissioners for review and approval Employee's proposed performance goals and objectives. During the term of this Agreement, the District shall conduct performance evaluations of Employee on an as needed basis.

District and Employee agree that one of the purposes of this Agreement is to provide an appropriate amount of time for District to consider whether Employee should be appointed to a permanent position as Chief of Police and District Manager. Therefore, District further agrees that, no later than six months from the effective date of this Agreement, the Board of Commissioners will meet and consider whether it is appropriate to offer to amend this Agreement to employ Employee for a defined term or to make other changes to appoint Employee to a permanent position.

#### 8. Termination

8.1. This Agreement terminates upon the first of the following occurrences:

8.1.1. By Employee, upon giving to District not less than 30 days prior written notice of his election to terminate. District reserves the right to place Employee on paid administrative leave for all or a portion of the period of notice provided.

8.1.2. By majority vote of the Board of Commissioners, upon providing Employee with at least thirty (30) days' written notice. The District reserves the right to place Employee on paid administrative leave for all or a portion of the period of notice provided.

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8.2. Upon termination of this Agreement, Employee shall be paid for all accrued, unused vacation time at Employee's then-applicable regular rate of pay.

8.3. Notwithstanding the provisions of any District rule, regulation, policy, procedure or practice to the contrary, upon termination of Employee's employment, whether as a result of termination or otherwise, and whether with or without cause, Employee will not be entitled to any compensation, damages or other monetary award except as specifically authorized by this Agreement.

8.4. Employee's employment by the District is "at-will," and subject to termination without any right of notice or hearing, including any due process predisciplinary "Skelly hearing," except for such rights and notice as specifically set forth in this Agreement.

9. Entire Agreement. This writing constitutes the sole, entire, integrated and exclusive contract between the parties respecting Employee's employment by District, and any other contracts, contract terms, understandings, promises or representations not expressly set forth or referenced in this writing are null and void and of no force and effect.

10. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. The county and federal district court where District is located shall be venue for any state and federal court litigation concerning the enforcement or construction of this Agreement.

11. Notices. Any notice to be given to Employee will be sufficiently served if given to him personally, or if deposited in the United States Mail, regular pre-paid mail, addressed to him at his most recent residence address as shown on the District payroll records. Any notice to be given by Employee to District will be addressed to the District Board of Commissioners and delivered or mailed to the District Secretary at the District offices.

12. Recitals Incorporated. The recitals set forth in this Agreement are incorporated by reference and are intended to be used in interpreting this Agreement.

13. Indemnification. The District shall, to the fullest extent of the law, including as provided by the California Tort Claims Act (Government Code section 810, et. seq.) defend, hold harmless, and indemnify Employee from and against all claims, liability, damages, and expenses (including attorney, expert witness and litigation costs) arising out of, pertaining to, or relating to any alleged act or omission in the performance of Employee's duties on behalf of the District, provided that such indemnity shall not extend to any claims arising out of any willful misconduct on the part of the Employee. This indemnification provisions shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

14. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement is personal to Employee. He may not transfer or assign the Agreement or any part of it. Subject to this restriction on transfer and assignment by Employee, this Agreement will bind, and inure to the benefit of, the successors, assigns, heirs and legal representatives of the parties.

15. Amendments. This Agreement may be amended only by a subsequent written amendment approved and signed by District and Employee. Any amendment by District must be approved by the Board of Commissioners at a public meeting. Individual

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Commissioners do not have the authority, express or implied, to amend, modify, waive or in way alter this Agreement or the terms and conditions of Employee's employment.

16. Waiver. The waiver at any time by either party of its rights with respect to a default or other matter arising in connection with this Agreement will not be deemed a waiver with respect to any subsequent default or matter.

17. Construction and Interpretation. The parties agree and acknowledge that this Agreement has been arrived at through negotiation, and that each party has had a full and fair opportunity to revise the terms of this Agreement. Consequently, the normal rule of construction that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party will not apply in construing or interpreting this Agreement.





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

Be it hereby resolved that the Board of Police Commissioners, Broadmoor Police Protection District, County of San Mateo instill the following resolution as prescribed by the appropriate code section and the authorization of the voters of the District:

WHEREAS, an election is hereby called to be held in and for the Broadmoor Police Protection District on November 08, 2022 to elect 2 members of the Governing Board for a full term of 4 years each, and 0 members of the Governing Board for a short term of 0 years each.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code 10002, the Governing Board of the Broadmoor police Protection District hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo to make available the services of the San Mateo County Chief Elections Officer & Assessor – County Clerk – Recorder (the "Chiefs Elections Officer") as the County Elections Official for the purpose of rendering services in the conduct of the election to be held on November 8, 2022.

WHEREAS, the election to be held on November 8, 2022 will be conducted atlarge.

Each governing board member shall reside in the jurisdiction and shall be elected by the registered voters of the entire jurisdiction.

Whereas, pursuant to Elections code 10509, not less than 125 days prior to the date of the election, the jurisdiction secretary shall deliver a notice to the Chief Elections Officer. The notice shall bear the secretary's signature and the district seal and shall also contain both of the following:

- (a) The elective offices of the jurisdiction to be filled at the next general district election, specifying which offices, if any are for the balance of an unexpired term.
- (b) Whether the jurisdiction of the candidate is to pay for the publication of a candidate statement.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections code 10522, not less than 125 days prior to the date of the election, the Broadmoor Police Protection District shall deliver the Chief Elections Officer a map showing the boundaries of the jurisdiction and the boundaries of the divisions of the jurisdiction, if any, within the County and a statement indicating in which divisions a member of the Governing Board is to be elected and whether any elective officer is to be elected at large at the next general district election.

**WHEREAS**, the District Manager of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby is authorized and directed to enter an Elections Service Agreement with the chief Elections Officer regarding the election to be held on November 8, 2022 to outline the detailed service to be proved by both the Broadmoor Police Protection District and the Chief Elections Officer.

WHEREAS, the Chief Elections Officer shall send an itemized invoice to the Broadmoor Police Protection District for all services provided pursuant to the Elections Service Agreement after the election is conducted and all related costs are determined. The Broadmoor Police Protection District agrees to submit payment on the full amount of the invoice to the County of San Mateo within forty-five (45) days of the date of the invoice.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that pursuant to Elections Code 13307, each candidate for the Governing Board to be voted in the election to be held on November 8, 2022 may prepare a candidate statement on the appropriate form provided by the Chief Elections Officer. Such statement shall be limited to 200 words. The prorated costs of printing, mailing, and translating the statements shall be paid by candidate.

## Waiving Closed Session Confidentiality for Certain Commission Closed Sessions

Whereas...

- The Board of Police Commissioners ("Commission") serves as the legislative body for the Broadmoor Police Protection District.
- Commission meetings are governed by the Brown Act (Gov. Code, §§ 54950 et. seq.).
- Government Code section 54957 authorizes the Commission to meet in closed session to consider public employee appointment, employment, performance evaluation, discipline, dismissal, and release.
- In Resolution No. 2007/2008-05, the Commission delegated authority to appoint and dismiss District employees to the Chief of Police.
- On April 19, 2021, former reserve police officer Syed Husain filed a Petition for Writ of Mandate in the San Mateo County Superior Court (Case No. 21-CIV-02244) alleging, among other things, the Commission violated the Brown Act by holding closed sessions that were not authorized by the Brown Act.
- The Commission and District deny the Petition's allegations.
- Government Code section 54963 prohibits any person from disclosing confidential information that has been acquired by being present in a Commission closed session unless the Commission authorizes disclosure of that confidential information.
- In order to defend the District against the Petition's allegations, the Commission has determined it is necessary to authorize disclosure of certain confidential information acquired by Commissioners and District employees in Commission closed sessions.

Now therefore be it resolved...

- Under Government Code section 54963, the Commission authorizes Commissioners and former and current District employees, to the extent necessary to defend the Commission and District in court proceedings regarding the Petition, to disclose the substance of Commission closed session meetings held between July 1, 2020 and July 13, 2021 and authorized by Government Code section 54957.
- Under Government Code section 54963, the Commission authorizes Commissioners and former and current District employees, to the extent necessary to defend the Commission and District in court proceedings regarding the Petition, to disclose the substance of Commission closed session meetings, if any, concerning the appointment, employment, performance evaluation, discipline, dismissal or release of Michael Connolly, David Parenti, Steven Landi, Syed Husain, and Victor Khedr.
- The disclosure authorized by this Resolution is expressly limited by the terms of this Resolution and shall not extend to disclosure of confidential information protected by the attorney-client privilege, attorney work product doctrine, or any basis not expressly waived by this Resolution.
- Except as expressly provided in this Resolution, this Resolution shall not be deemed to waive any objection that may be asserted by the District or Commission in court proceedings regarding the Petition.

### RESOLUTION 2022 - 02

# AMMENDING CHAPTER 706 TO THE BROADMOOR POLICE DEPARTMENT POLICY MANUEL REGARDING POLICE ACQUISITION AND USE OF "MILITARY EQUIPMENT"

# BE IT ORDAINED by the Commission of the Broadmoor Police Protection District as follows:

#### **Definitions:**

A. "Military Equipment" includes all of the following (Per CA Gov. Code §7070): 1. Unmanned, remotely piloted, powered aerial or ground vehicles.

 Mine-resistant ambush-protected (MRAP) vehicles or armored personnel carriers however, police versions of standard consumer vehicles are specifically excluded from this subdivision.

 High mobility multipurpose wheeled vehicles (HMMWV), commonly referred to as Humvees, two and one-half-ton trucks, five-ton trucks, or wheeled vehicles that have a breaching or entry apparatus attached. However, unarmored all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) and motorized dirt bikes are specifically excluded from this subdivision.

Tracked armored vehicles that provide ballistic protection to their occupants and utilize a tracked system instead of wheels for forward motion.

Command and control vehicles that are either built or modified to facilitate the operational control and direction of public safety units.

6. Weaponized aircraft, vessels, or vehicles of any kind.

 Battering rams, slugs, and breaching apparatuses that are explosive in nature. However, items designed to remove a lock, such as bolt cutters, or a handheld ram designed to be operated by one person, are specifically excluded from this subdivision.

 Firearms of .50 caliber or greater. However, standard issue shotguns are specifically excluded from this subdivision.

9. Ammunition of .50 caliber or greater. However, standard issue shotgun ammunition is specifically excluded from this subdivision.

10. Specialized firearms and ammunition of less than .50 caliber, including assault weapons as defined in Sections 30510 and 30515 of the Penal Code, with the exception of standard issue service weapons and ammunition of less than .50 caliber that are issued to officers, agents, or employees of a law enforcement agency or a state agency.

11. Any firearm or firearm accessory that is designed to launch explosive projectiles.

12. "Flashbang" grenades and explosive breaching tools, "tear gas," and "pepper balls," excluding standard, service-issued handheld pepper spray.

13. Taser Shockwave, microwave weapons, water cannons, and the Long Range Acoustic Device (LRAD).

14. The following projectile launch platforms and their associated munitions: 40mm projectile launchers, "bean bag," rubber bullet, and specialty impact munition (SIM) weapons.

15. Any other equipment as determined by a governing body or a state agency to require additional oversight.

16. Notwithstanding paragraphs (1) through (15), "Military Equipment" does not include general equipment not designated as prohibited or controlled by the federal Defense Logistics Agency.

- B. "District" means any department, agency, bureau, and/or subordinate division of the Broadmoor Police Protection District.
- C. "Police Department" means any division, section, bureau, employee, volunteer and/or contractor of the Broadmoor Police Protection District.
- D. "Commission" means the governing body that is the Broadmoor Police Protection District.
- E. "Military Equipment Use Policy" means a publicly released, written document that includes, at a minimum, all of the following:

1. A description of each type of Military Equipment, the quantity sought, its capabilities, expected lifespan, and product descriptions from the manufacturer of the Military Equipment.

2. The purposes and authorized uses for which the law enforcement agency or the state agency proposes to use each type of Military Equipment.

3. The fiscal impact of each type of Military Equipment, including the initial costs of obtaining the equipment and estimated annual costs of maintaining the equipment.

4. The legal and procedural rules that govern each authorized use.

5. The training, including any course required by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), that must be completed before any officer, agent, or employee of the law enforcement agency or the state agency is allowed to use each specific type of Military Equipment to ensure the full protection of the public's welfare, safety, civil rights, and civil liberties and full adherence to the Military Equipment use policy.

6. The mechanisms to ensure compliance with the Military Equipment use policy, including which independent persons or entities have oversight authority, and, if applicable, what legally enforceable sanctions are put in place for violations of the policy.

7. For a law enforcement agency, the procedures by which members of the public may register complaints or concerns or submit questions about the use of each specific type of Military Equipment, and how the law enforcement agency will ensure that each complaint, concern, or question receives a response in a timely manner.

- F. "Exigent Circumstances" means a law enforcement agency's good faith belief that an emergency involving the danger of, or imminent threat of death or serious physical injury to any person is occurring, has occurred, or is about to occur.
- G. "State agency" means the law enforcement division of every state office, officer, department, division, bureau, board, and commission or other state body or agency, except those agencies provided for in Article IV (except Section 20 thereof) or Article VI of the California Constitution.
- H. "Type" means each item that shares the same manufacturer model number.

#### **Military Equipment Use Policy Requirement**

A. The Broadmoor Police Department shall obtain approval of the Commission, by

Resolution adopting a Military Equipment Use Policy (MEUP) at a regular meeting of the Commission held pursuant to the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act (Article 9 (commencing with Section 11120) of Chapter 1 of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2) or the Ralph M. Brown Act (Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 54950) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5), as applicable, prior to engaging in any of the following:

1. Requesting Military Equipment made available pursuant to Section 2576a of Title 10 of the United States Code.

2. Seeking funds for Military Equipment, including, but not limited to, applying for a grant, soliciting or accepting private, local, state, or federal funds, in-kind donations, or other donations or transfers.

3. Acquiring Military Equipment either permanently or temporarily, including by borrowing or leasing.

4. Collaborating with another law enforcement agency in the deployment or other use of Military Equipment within the territorial jurisdiction of the Broadmoor Police Protection District.

5. Using any new or existing Military Equipment for a purpose, in a manner, or by a person not previously approved by the governing body pursuant to this chapter.

6. Soliciting or responding to a proposal for, or entering into an agreement with, any other person or entity to seek funds for, apply to receive, acquire, use, or collaborate in the use of, Military Equipment.

7. Acquiring Military Equipment through any means not provided by this section.

- B. No later than May 1, 2022, if seeking to continue the use of any Military Equipment that was acquired prior to January 1, 2022, the Broadmoor Police Department shall commence a Commission approval process in accordance with this section. If the Commission does not approve the continuing use of Military Equipment, including by adoption pursuant to a Military Equipment Use Policy submitted pursuant to this code, within 180 days of submission of the proposed Military Equipment Use Policy to the Commission, the Broadmoor Police Department shall cease its use of the Military Equipment until it receives the approval of the Commission in accordance with this code.
- C. In seeking the approval of the Commission, the Broadmoor Police Department shall submit a proposed Military Equipment Use Policy to the Commission and make those documents available on the Police Department's Internet Website at least 30 days prior to any public hearing concerning the Military Equipment at issue.

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- D. The governing body shall consider a proposed Military Equipment Use policy as an agenda item for an open session of a regular meeting and provide for public comment in accordance with the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act (Article 9 (commencing with Section 11120) of Chapter 1 of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2) or the Ralph M. Brown Act (Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 54950) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5), as applicable.
- E. The governing body shall only approve a Military Equipment Use Policy pursuant to this chapter if it determines all of the following:

1. The Military Equipment is necessary because there is no reasonable alternative that can achieve the same objective of officer and civilian safety.

2. The proposed Military Equipment use policy will safeguard the public's welfare, safety, civil rights, and civil liberties.

3. If purchasing the equipment, the equipment is reasonably cost effective compared to available alternatives that can achieve the same objective of officer and civilian safety.

4. Prior Military Equipment use complied with the Military Equipment Use Policy that was in effect at the time, or if prior uses did not comply with the accompanying Military Equipment Use Policy, corrective action has been taken to remedy nonconforming uses and ensure future compliance.

F. In order to facilitate public participation, any proposed or final Military Equipment Use Policy shall be made publicly available on the internet website of the Police Department for as long as the Military Equipment is available for use.

G. The Commission shall review any resolution that it has adopted pursuant to this Chapter approving the funding, acquisition, or use of Military Equipment at least annually and vote on whether to renew the resolution at a regular meeting held pursuant to the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act (Article 9 (commencing with Section 11120) of Chapter 1 of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2) or the Ralph M. Brown Act (Chapter 9 (commencing with Section 54950) of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5), as applicable.

#### **Use in Exigent Circumstances**

A. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Chapter, the Police Department may acquire, borrow and/or use Military Equipment in Exigent Circumstances without following the requirements of this code.

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B. The Broadmoor Police Department participates with the San Mateo County Peninsula Special Response Teams as well as closely with local, county, state, and federal partners. In exigent circumstances and with the approval of the Chief of Police or designee, military equipment may be deployed from outside entities to promote the safety and security of our community members.

Military equipment used by other jurisdictions that are providing mutual aid to this jurisdiction shall comply with their respective military equipment use policies in rendering mutual aid."

C. If the Police Department acquires, borrows, and/or uses Military Equipment in Exigent Circumstances, in accordance with this section, it must take all of the following actions:

1. Provide written notice of that acquisition or use to the Commission within 30 days following the commencement of such Exigent Circumstance, unless such information is confidential or privileged under local, state or federal law.

2. If it is anticipated that the use will continue beyond the Exigent Circumstance, submit a proposed amended Military Equipment Use Policy to the Commission within 90 days following the borrowing, acquisition and/or use, and receive approval, as applicable, from the Commission.

3. Include the Military Equipment in the Police Department's next annual Military Equipment Report.

#### **Reports on the Use of Military Equipment**

- A. The Police Department shall submit to the Commission an annual Military Equipment Report for each type of Military Equipment approved by the Commission within one year of approval, and annually thereafter for as long as the Military Equipment is available for use.
- B. The Police Department shall also make each annual Military Equipment Report required by this section publicly available on its internet website for as long as the Military Equipment is available for use.
- C. The annual Military Equipment Report shall, at a minimum, include the following information for the immediately preceding calendar year for each type of Military Equipment:
  - 1. A summary of how the Military Equipment was used and the purpose of its use.

. . . .

- 2. A summary of any complaints or concerns received concerning the Military Equipment.
- 3. The results of any internal audits, any information about violations of the Military Equipment Use Policy, and any actions taken in response.
- 4. The total annual cost for each type of Military Equipment, including acquisition, personnel, training, transportation, maintenance, storage, upgrade, and other ongoing costs, and from what source funds will be provided for the Military Equipment in the calendar year following submission of the annual Military Equipment Report.
- 5. The quantity possessed for each type of Military Equipment.
- 6. If the law enforcement agency intends to acquire additional Military Equipment in the next year, the quantity sought for each type of Military Equipment.
- D. Within 30 days of submitting and publicly releasing an annual Military Equipment Report pursuant to this section, the Police Department shall hold at least one wellpublicized and conveniently located community engagement meeting, at which the general public may discuss and ask questions regarding the annual Military Equipment report and the law enforcement agency's funding, acquisition, or use of Military Equipment.
- E. The Commission shall determine, based on the annual Military Equipment Report submitted pursuant to this section, whether each type of Military Equipment identified in that report has complied with the standards for approval set forth in this code and the Military Equipment Use Policy. If the City Council determines that a type of Military Equipment identified in that annual Military Equipment Report has not complied with the standards for approval, the Commission shall either disapprove a renewal of the authorization for that type of Military Equipment or require modifications to the Military Equipment Use Policy in a manner that will resolve the lack of compliance.

#### **Enforcement.**

A. Remedies for Violations of this Ordinance

1. This Chapter does not provide a private right of action upon any person or entity to seek injunctive relief against the District or any employee unless that person or entity has first provided written notice to the Chief of Police / District Manager regarding the specific alleged violations of this Chapter.

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2. If a specific alleged violation is not remedied within 90 days of that written notice, a person or entity may seek injunctive relief in a court of competent jurisdiction.

3. If the alleged violation is substantiated and subsequently cured, a notice shall be posted in a conspicuous manner on the District's website that describes, to the extent permissible by law, the corrective measures taken to address the violation.

#### Severability

- A. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Chapter, or any application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this Chapter.
- B. The Commission hereby declares that it would have passed this Chapter and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, and word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any other portion of this Chapter or application thereof would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

# Resolution to Establish Annual District Negotiation Schedule for all Employee Classifications / and the Confirming of Personnel Appointments for all Employee Classifications

Be it hereby resolved that the Board of Police Commissioners, Broadmoor Police Protection District, County of San Mateo:

Whereas, a clearly drafted and implemented agreement sets out the obligations and expectations of the District and its employees in a way to minimize future disputes and ensure that all employees are treated equally and fairly;

Now therefore let it be resolved, that the District hereby agrees to negotiate with all employees on an annual basis;

The Commission appoints the Chief of Police / District Manager as it's negotiator for negotiating the terms of employment for all subordinate employees;

All employees represented by a recognized employee organization will negotiate through that organization's duly-appointed representatives with the Chief of Police / District Manager;

All unrepresented subordinate employees will negotiate directly with the Chief of Police / District Manager;

The Chief of Police / District Manager will negotiate directly with the Commission subject to the terms of any employment agreement between the District and the Chief of Police / District Manager;

Following said negotiations with subordinate employees, the Chief of Police / District Manager will present to the Commission a draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), of which said draft can be approved or returned for further negotiations.

Once approved by the Commission, the MOU with all employee classes will last for a period of one year, generally the fiscal year beginning July 1<sup>st</sup> and expiring on June 30<sup>th</sup> of the succeeding year, and there cannot be any changes to the MOU without prior approval of the Commission;

To promote transparency in compensation, the Commission directs that the approved salary schedule for all employees be attached as an addendum to the Memorandum of Understanding;

To promote transparency in hiring, amongst the Commission, the agency itself, and most importantly the residents of the District, the Chief will forward to the Commission for confirmation all employee(s) or volunteer(s) by name and classification who the Chief has employed or approved, as appropriate, to serve the District;

This Resolution is declarative of existing District practices, and nothing set forth in this Resolution shall be interpreted to amend any existing agreement between the District and any other party.
