Dear Chief Connolly:

Thank you for allowing BPM, LLP ("BPM") to provide the Broadmoor Police Department ("Department" or "Client") with this engagement letter for consulting services. We appreciate the opportunity to be of service to the Department. We believe this letter accurately summarizes the significant terms of our engagement. BPM requires written agreements with all our clients and this letter shall serve as our agreement.

The general nature of our services will include advisory services regarding the fiscal year budget for 2024/2025, in addition to forecasting revenues and expenses for the next five (5) fiscal years. Based on our conversations, we expect our work will conclude with an effort to estimate the required per parcel amount for the upcoming November 2024 ballot measure to provide the necessary financial support for the Department's effort to achieve fiscal stability for the next five years.

Steve Daughters, CPA, MBA, will oversee this engagement. Mr. Daughters' discounted hourly rate is \$650. BPM's policy is to use the lowest cost professionals available, while still insuring outstanding quality. As a result, you can expect different BPM staff members to contribute to this engagement as appropriate. You will find our 2024 rate schedule attached as Exhibit B. Professional services are charged based on our professionals' hourly rate times the number of hours worked (calculated to the nearest .1 hour).

We will require a retainer of \$25,000 to commence work. The retainer is held and applied to the final invoice at the conclusion of the engagement. Any unused portion of the retainer after application to the final invoice is fully refundable. BPM has a monthly billing cycle. BPM invoices are due and payable upon presentation.

COMMENCEMENT OF WORK

This engagement letter, including the terms and conditions in Exhibit A and any other attachments, reflects the entire agreement between us relating to the services covered by this letter. It replaces and supersedes any previous proposals, correspondence, and understandings, whether written or oral. The agreements contained in this engagement letter shall survive the completion or the termination of this engagement. In the event the Client files for bankruptcy protection, to the extent any portion of this agreement conflicts with or is superseded by the Bankruptcy Code, it shall not apply. Exhibit A: Consulting Engagement Letter Terms & Conditions

Agreement

These Terms and Conditions, together with the engagement letter ("Engagement Letter") to which these Terms and Conditions are attached, including any exhibits and appendixes thereto, constitute the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the Services (this "Agreement"). Hence, references to this Agreement mean the Engagement Letter with all attachments thereto including these Terms and Conditions.

All capitalized terms used in these Terms and Conditions and not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings given them in the Engagement Letter. In the event of a conflict among the provisions of the Engagement Letter and these Terms and Conditions, the Engagement Letter shall be given controlling effect. BPM may be referred to herein as "we", "our" or "us" or in a similar manner, and Client may be referred to as "you" or "your" or in a similar manner, and such references shall be read in context.

Commencement and Term

This Agreement is effective upon execution of the Engagement Letter by both parties and shall remain in full force and effect until the earlier of (i) completion of the Services (as reasonably determined by BPM) to be delivered under this Agreement, (ii) termination of this engagement by either party as provided in the Agreement.

Payment of Fees

Our billings are due and payable upon receipt and will be considered past due after 30 days. We will assess a finance charge on any balances that are more than 45 days past due at the rate of 12% per annum (1% per month). If the Client fails to meet any payment obligation under this engagement, we may immediately suspend performance of the Services to be performed or terminate this engagement. If we elect to suspend performance due to nonpayment, the Services will not be resumed until your account is paid as agreed, including any retainer that we may require to continue the Services under this arrangement. Alternatively, if we elect to terminate the engagement due to nonpayment, you will be obligated to compensate us for all time and expenses incurred through the date of such termination.

Our rates are subject to change each November 1 of the calendar year.

Waiver of any Actual or Perceived Conflict of Interest

BPM receives the preponderance of its business through referrals from financial institutions, private equity sponsors, venture capital firms, attorneys, and other professionals. The firm has no exclusive relationships with any referral source. The firm does not receive any referral fees nor pay any referral fees from/to any referral source.

Records Retention

RE :	Proposal to adjust qualified special parcel tax for FY 2024/2025

INTRODUCTION

The District like most, perhaps all, public entities in the state is facing a significant increase in operational costs for fiscal year 2024/2025.

The attached 2024/2025 preliminary draft Budget¹ shows a very tight budget, although better than the FY 2023/2024 budget. The fiscal health of the District for FY 2024/2025 appears to be an improvement from FY 2023/2024 due in large part to some legal expenses that will not likely be incurred until the next fiscal year and the temporary reduction in some operating costs notwithstanding the increase in such costs.

DISCUSSION

In order to help defray or offset some of the unprecedented costs the District is likely to incur next fiscal year and restore some deferred operational expenses an adjustment in the special tax (parcel tax) will provide some assistance and relief in that regard.

In order to continue to adequately staff the District, and to provide the high quality police and related services to the community that the community has enjoyed since 1948, the Commission should consider increasing the qualified special tax currently in place. The last upward adjustment in the special tax was FY 2023/2024. (Resolution 2023/24-02)

¹ The preliminary draft budget is included with this Staff Report solely for reference purposes. The final budget might be very different from the preliminary draft budget.

Resolution 1999/2000-09, which was adopted on February 17, 2000, formed the basis of Measure A that was passed by the voters of the District in an election on May 16, 2000, with a 90% affirmative vote. That ballot measure is remains the basis of the District's qualified special parcel tax today and provides the Commission with the authority to annually adjust the qualified special tax in an amount not to exceed 5% of the current special tax. The current special tax is set forth in Resolution 2023/24-02. If proposed Resolution 2024/25-05 is adopted, that Resolution would result in an upward adjustment by 5%.

RECOMMENDATION

I propose that the current special tax imposed upon each parcel of real property located within the District be increased by 5% as more fully set forth in proposed Resolution No. 2024/25-05 for FY 2024/2025 effective July 1, 2024, and that such Resolution should be approved, passed and adopted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the special tax rates provided and set forth in Resolution No. 2023/24-02 are hereby adjusted as set forth below, which are approved and adopted for FY 2024/2025; and,

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that the special tax effective FY 2024/2025 is hereby levied against and imposed upon each and every parcel of real property situated within the District as follows:

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that the special tax provided herein shall be subject to all the same penalties as the *ad valorem* taxes collected by

the Tax Collector. The special tax and penalty shall bear interest at the same rate as the rate for unpaid *ad valorem* property taxes until paid; and,

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED that the Secretary or Clerk of this Board shall furnish the Tax Collector of the County of San Mateo and the Controller of the County of San Mateo all information required in order to implement the special tax provided in this Resolution; and,

BACKGROUND

As shown in the budget that the Police Commission adopted at the last meeting of the of the Commission, the District, like almost all public entities in San Mateo County and throughout the state, is in need of short-term additional funds in order to provide a level of service the residents and businesses of Broadmoor have come to expect.

Moreover, inflation has significantly increased the District's cost of operations that the District has to some extent offset by temporarily reducing such operational costs. Nevertheless, a short-term infusion of additional funds is necessary to restore those reductions.

DISCUSSION

As has been previously discussed with the Commission, a short-term special parcel tax is needed to help the District during times when the District and most, if not all, cities, counties and special districts throughout the State of California are having budgetary problems stemming from runaway inflation. A short-term special tax will require a ballot measure to be approved by the voters. In order to complete the ballot measure and get it before the Commission for consideration, the amount needed for the shortterm special tax must be included in the proposed ballot measure. At the Special Meeting of the Commission on June 20, 2024, the District's consultant, NBS, presented four alternative proposals for a ballot measure. The Police Commission approved the retention of NBS, a wellrespected consulting firm approved by the Commission that provides public agencies with strategies and models for improving revenue and guidance with ballot measures. NBS has submitted a very detailed proposal that sets forth various models or strategies for revenue production for the Commission's consideration. A copy of that proposal is attached.

According to NBS, the short-term special tax needed for will be \$700,000 the first year, which can be increased by 5% for years two through five. (See attached.)

On June 20, 2024, at a special meeting of the Police Commission, Sara Mares and Nick Dayhoff of NBS delivered a comprehensive presentation to the Commission and the public in attendance at that meeting. NBS offered four models for the proposed limited special parcel tax.

I have previously published and shared with the Commission four models, which were also discussed at length at the Special Meeting on June 20, 2024. I include with this Staff Report four models prepared by NBS.

I have carefully reviewed and studied the several NBS models, which I discussed at length with NBS personnel. Based upon my review of the models, and after discussions with NBS and legal counsel, we have come up with a model that will have the least impact on single family homes, yet provide the District with the funding it needs. I have incorporated that model into a proposed form of Resolution, which I have attached to this Staff Report.

Notice of the hearing has been posted and published in accordance with law.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that the Commission approve and adopt proposed Resolution 2024/25-01, a copy of which I have attached to this Staff Report.

The Broadmoor Police Protection District (the "District") has requested that NBS model special tax rates related to the feasibility of creating a new parcel tax to fund forecasted shortfalls in the District's ongoing operational budget. This evaluation includes modeling of three options for a new *uniform* parcel tax, and three options for a *non-uniform* parcel tax. This memorandum summarizes the special tax rates via each scenario.

Revenue Targets

The following table shows the annual revenue targets for FY 2025-26 through FY 2029-30, based on budgetary information provided by the District. The revenue target for the first year would be \$700,000 and would increase by 5% annually in line with assumed increases in the parcel tax rates:

Parcel Data

The parcel database was compiled using data from the San Mateo County Assessor. According to such data, the District comprises 1,532 Assessor's parcels, of which 1,502 were determined to be "Taxable" and 30 were determined to be "Exempt." Exempt properties include public property and utilities.

Property Type was assigned based on County Use Code. Unit counts are somewhat incomplete in the Assessor's data, so that was compiled by referencing County Use Code and independent research to fill in the gaps.

Lot square footage in the Assessor's data appears to be unreliable—especially for parcels that share common lots such as condominiums/townhomes—so NBS utilized GIS to calculate lot square footage for each parcel. NBS recommends that the administrator of any potential parcel tax utilize GIS calculations of lot square footage, if and where applicable.

Similarly, the building square footage data in the Assessor's data doesn't seem reliable either; however, there is no remedy to research that data in a timely fashion, so we have relied on the available Assessor's data with some added independent research to fill in gaps where information is not included in the Assessor's data. We note here that building square footage data is usually one of the most unreliable statistics in the Assessors' data throughout the State of California.

Recommended Methodology

NBS recommends that the District choose the first non-uniform methodology described above, with varying rates per residential unit, a rate per Building SF for Non-Residential Property, and a rate per Lot SF for Undeveloped Property. This methodology results in the lowest average parcel tax on Single Family Residential Property (\$343.33), which is certainly the property type with the most likely registered voters in the District. Assigning units to residential property is relatively easy in San Mateo County, given the current Assessor's Use Code descriptions, and as there are only 12 Multi-Family Residential Properties with five or more units (per the Assessor's Use Codes), those unit counts are easily verifiable via third-party resources. Building SF would only need to be verified for the 37 Non-Residential Properties in the District, and GIS would be utilized to measure Lot SF on the 23 Undeveloped Properties in the District.

Resolution No. 2024/25-01

A RESOLUTION CALLING A GENERAL DISTRICT ELECTION FOR NOVEMBER 5, 2024 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE VOTERS OF THE DISTRICT A PROPOSAL TO LEVY A LIMITED SUPPLEMENTAL SPECIAL TAX ON ALL PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY IN THE DISTRICT FOR FIVE YEARS AND TO INCREASE THE DISTRICT'S APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT; AND TO REQUEST CONSOLIDATION OF THIS GENERAL DISTRICT ELECTION WITH THE STATEWIDE GENERAL ELECTION OF SAME DATE

WHEREAS, since 1948 when the Broadmoor Police Protection District of San Mateo County ("District") was formed, the residents and merchants of the District have been provided with law enforcement and police protection services at a level substantially above level of service available to them absent the existence of the District; and,

WHEREAS, since the inception of the District the residents and merchants have enjoyed a relatively crime-free community, wholly inconsistent with the surrounding area, due entirely to the enhanced law enforcement and police protection services provided by the District's police department, and that such services have since the inception of the District been funded in part by a special parcel tax; and, WHEREAS, the Board of Police Commissioners of the District desires to submit to the voters a measure that would establish a limited special parcel tax at the rates set forth herein per year per parcel in order to provide additional funding for police protection, crime prevention, emergency response services and any other authorized District activities; and,

WHEREAS, the parcel tax will be a special tax, the proceeds of which are to be deposited into a special District account, created and maintained by the District, and used only for the specific purposes identified herein; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Constitution, Articles XIII A §4, XIII C §2(d), XIII D, §3(a), and California Government Code §§50077, 53722, and 53724, the District may not impose any new, or extend any existing special parcel tax unless and until that tax is submitted to the electorate and approved by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the qualified electors voting in the election; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Health and Safety Code §20110 and California Government Code §50077, the Board of Police Commissioners has authority to place special tax measures on the ballot to be considered at a District Election; and,

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WHEREAS, pursuant to Proposition 62 (California Government Code §53724(c) and (d)), a local tax election may be consolidated with a statewide primary election, a statewide general election, or a regularly scheduled local election at which all of the electors of the local government are entitled to vote, or held on any other election date permitted by law; and,

WHEREAS, the Statewide General Election for President of the United States and for other Federal, State and local offices, and the District's General Election are all scheduled for November 5, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Government Code §50075 *et* seq., this Board does hereby adopt this Resolution to levy a limited supplemental special tax for police protection, crime prevention, emergency response services and any other authorized District activities; and,

WHEREAS, since the passage of Proposition 13 in 1978 the voters of the District have consistently and overwhelming cast their votes to impose a special tax upon the real property situated within the District so that the residents and merchants of the District will continue to receive the enhanced law enforcement and police protection services to which they have become accustomed and which they have had in place since 1948; and,

WHEREAS, this Board finds, has determined and declares that a limited supplemental special tax to augment existing property tax revenue is necessary and vital in order for the District to remain viable and to continue to provide the special benefits of substantially enhanced police protection, crime prevention, emergency response service and all other authorized District activities; and,

WHEREAS, the State of California and local governments within the state are all facing severe financial shortages and deficits, including the District; and,

WHEREAS, this Board finds and determines that without the limited supplemental special parcel tax prescribed by this Resolution, there will be a fiscal shortfall, and that each and every fiscal year thereafter there will be a similar shortfall in revenue to the extent that the District is not likely to remain viable unless the proposed supplemental special parcel tax is imposed or other sources of revenue are attained, which is not likely; and,

WHEREAS, on July 9, 2024, the Board of Police Commissioners held a public hearing after due notice regarding calling for an election on a ballot measure approving a limited supplemental special parcel tax; and,

WHEREAS, if approved, the special parcel tax will be collected starting on July 1, 2025, and may be imposed each year thereafter for until June 30, 2030 (five year term); and,

WHEREAS, the Measure, the specific terms of approval, and the collection and use of the revenues of the special parcel tax are described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it hereby resolved, ordered and declared by the Board of Police Commissioners and the People of the Broadmoor Police Protection District as follows:

ELECTION PROVISIONS

Section 1: Pursuant to California Constitution, Articles XIII A §4, XIII C §2(d), XIII D, §3(a), California Health and Safety Code §20110 and California Government Code §§50077, 53722, and 53724, an election shall be and it is hereby ordered to submit the proposed limited supplemental special parcel tax to the voters of the District at the General District Election to be held on November 5, 2024.

Section 2: The measure shall be presented and printed upon the ballot with the following ballot question to be included therein:

BROADMOOR POLICE LIMITED SUPPLEMENTAL SPECIAL PARCEL TAX FOR POLICE PROTECTION, CRIME PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Shall the measure to establish a limited (five year term) supplemental special tax on each parcel of real property within the District commencing July 1, 2025, and ending on June 30, 2030, unless extended by the voters, at rates set forth in the measure with annual cost adjustments not to exceed 5%, generating approximately \$700,000 annually for police protection and related services, be adopted?

Section 3: The District election shall be held and conducted, and the voters thereof shall be canvassed, and the returns thereof shall be made, and the results thereof shall be ascertained and determined as herein provided by, and in accordance with, the applicable provisions of the Elections Code.

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Section 4: All persons qualified to vote at District elections in the District on November 5, 2024, shall be qualified to vote on the measure submitted by this Resolution at the District Election, which will be consolidated with the General District Election on November 5, 2024.

Section 5: The Chief of Police / District Manager is hereby instructed to cause a duly certified copy of this Resolution, which constitutes the order to hold and conduct an election and formal notice of such election, to be delivered to the Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder & Chief Elections Officer or other appropriate county election officer no later than August 9, 2024.

Section 6: The Chief of Police / District Manager is authorized, directed to and is fully empowered to execute all agreements, on behalf of and in the District's name, with the County of San Mateo Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder & Chief Elections Officer for such necessary election services as the may determine pursuant to law.

Section 7: Pursuant to Elections Code §§10403 and 10418 the Board of Police Commissioners requests the Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County to consolidate this District election with the Statewide General Election of same date and to further provide that the canvass be made by any person or official authorized by law to canvass the returns of the election, and this Board hereby consents to such consolidation and canvass.

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Section 8: The Board of Police Commissioners hereby requests that the District election on this measure be conducted along with and a part of the 2024 Statewide General Election on November 5, 2024, and shall pay all costs of the County in conducting said election for the District measure.

Section 9: Notice of the time and place of holding the election is hereby given. The Board of Police Commissioners hereby requests that the San Mateo County Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder & Chief Elections Officer or other duly authorized elections officer or person appointed by them, if applicable, cause all notices required by law in connection herewith to be published and posted, as the case may be, in the manner prescribed by law.

Section 10: Impartial Analysis. Pursuant to California Elections Code §9313, the Board of Police Commissioners hereby directs the Police Chief/District Manager to transmit a copy of the Measure as set forth herein to the San Mateo County Attorney's Office (formerly County Counsel). The County Attorney's Office, in coordination with the District's legal counsel, shall prepare an impartial analysis of the Measure, not to exceed 500 words in length, showing the effect of the Measure on the existing law and the operation of the Measure, and transmit such impartial analysis to the elections official not later than end of business on August 20, 2024, who shall cause the analysis to be published in the voter information guide along with the Measure as provided by law. The impartial analysis shall include a statement indicating whether the Measure was placed on the ballot by a petition signed by the requisite number of voters or by the Board of Police Commissioners. In the event the entire text of the Measure is not printed on the ballot, or in the voter information portion of the sample ballot, there shall be printed immediately below the impartial analysis, in no less than 10-point bold type, the following: "The above statement is an impartial analysis of Measure "___". If you desire a copy of the measure, please call the election official's office at (650) 312-5222 and a copy will be mailed at no cost to you."

SUBSTANTIVE PARCEL TAX PROVISIONS

Section 11: There shall be imposed upon every parcel of real property located entirely or partially within the District a limited supplemental special parcel tax in an amount and as provided in this Resolution.

Section 12: The limited supplemental special parcel tax for the first fiscal year commencing July 1, 2025, for Fiscal Year 2025/2026, shall be assessed and levied against each parcel of real property situated entirely or partially within the District in accordance with subsections (a) through (g) of this section, which shall be subject to an annual review and adjustment as provided in Section 4 of this Resolution. All property owned by public entities and public utilities will be exempt from the imposition of the limited supplemental special parcel tax provided herein so long such property is used exclusively by the public entity or public utility owning it. This exemption shall not apply to any property owned by a public entity or public utility that is

leased, licensed or rented to a private party for private use, whether or not for profit.

(a) <u>Single Family Residential Property</u>: Each primary dwelling unit on a parcel of Single Family Residential Property is subject to a limited supplemental special parcel tax of \$297.00 per primary dwelling unit located entirely or partially on each parcel.

(b) <u>Accessory Dwelling Unit</u>: Each Accessory Dwelling Unit is subject to a limited supplemental special parcel tax of \$267.30 per unit located entirely or partially on each parcel.

(c) <u>Multi-Family Residential Property</u>: Each dwelling unit on a parcel of <u>Multi-Family Residential</u> Property is subject to a limited supplemental special parcel tax of \$267.30 per unit located entirely or partially on each parcel.

(d) **Residential Care Property:** Each bed on a parcel of Residential Care Property is subject to a limited supplemental special parcel tax of \$237.60 per bed located entirely or partially on each parcel. The number of beds assigned to each parcel of Residential Care Property shall be based upon the maximum number of beds authorized by law or by a permit issued, whether or not such beds are occupied. In cases where the maximum number of authorized beds is exceeded, the limited supplemental special parcel tax shall be based upon the maximum number of beds authorized plus each bed in excess of the authorized amount. In those cases where no maximum number of beds is authorized, the tax shall be based on the highest number of beds each facility had on the premises at any single time during any fiscal year. The proper and designated official of the District may require the operators of such facilities to execute a statement of facts under penalty of perjury material to the tax.

(e) <u>Non-Residential Property</u>: Each parcel of Non-Residential Property is subject to a limited supplemental special parcel tax of \$0.5506 per building square foot located entirely or partially on each parcel.

(f) <u>Undeveloped Property</u>: Each parcel of Undeveloped Property is subject to a limited supplemental special parcel tax of \$0.0427 per lot square foot located entirely or partially on each parcel.

(g) <u>Mixed-Use Property</u>: Any parcel that contains more than one of the property types described in subsections (a) through (e) of this section shall be considered <u>Mixed-Use Property</u>. The limited supplemental special parcel tax on each parcel of <u>Mixed-Use Property</u> shall be the sum of the applicable tax for each of the property types described in subsections (a) through (e) of this section.

Section 13: In conjunction with the proposal of the limited supplemental special parcel tax the District's appropriations limit per fiscal year for the duration of the limited special parcel tax, commencing July 1, 2025, shall be equal to the increased levy of limited special tax for such year, as provided herein and as permitted by Article XIII B §4 of the California Constitution.

Section 14: Not later than June 30 of each fiscal year immediately succeeding the passage and adoption of the ballot measure approving the limited special parcel tax provided in this Resolution (commencing Fiscal Year 2026/2027) the Board, after notice and hearing, shall review the limited supplemental special parcel tax specified in Section 12, and each subparagraph thereof, and shall either continue the tax at the same rate for the next fiscal year or, if the Board determines that the tax should either be increased or decreased, adjust the tax for the next fiscal year at the hearing, subject to the maximum amount herein. The maximum amount the Board may fix without further voter approval shall be the baseline amount set forth in Section 12 for each class of parcel, plus an annual increase equivalent to the increase in costs to provide the services funded by this tax, shall not exceed 5% any fiscal year.

Section 15: Upon voter approval of the proposed measure, the Police Chief/District Manager or his/her authorized designee or employee is hereby authorized and directed each fiscal year, commencing with the fiscal year 2025-2026, to determine the special parcel tax amount to be levied for the next fiscal year for each taxable parcel of real property within the District, in the manner and as provided in accordance with this Resolution and the authorizations set forth herein. The limited supplemental special parcel tax shall be collected on behalf of the District by the County of San Mateo ("County") in the same manner and subject to the same penalties as, or with, other charges and taxes fixed and collected by the District, or by the County on behalf of the District. The Police Chief/District Manager or his/her authorized designee or employee is hereby authorized and directed to provide all necessary information to the County Treasurer-Tax Collector to effect proper billing and collection of the special parcel tax so that the installments of the tax shall be included on the secured property tax roll of the County. Unless the Board proposes a rate adjustment pursuant to Section 14, no Board action shall be required to authorize the annual collection of the special parcel tax as herein provided.

Section 16: The limited supplemental special parcel tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary *ad valorem* property taxes are collected; provided, however, that the Board may authorize other appropriate methods of collection of the limited supplemental special parcel tax by appropriate resolution(s). The limited supplemental special parcel tax so levied shall become a charge upon and a lien against the parcels on which the taxes are assessed and collectible, and to which the liens attach. The limited supplemental special parcel tax shall have the same lien priority and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency, as provided for *ad valorem* property taxes.

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Section 17: The collection of the limited supplemental special parcel tax provided for herein shall not in any way, directly or indirectly, decrease the funds available to the District from all other sources from which the District receives or derives revenue. Nor shall the collection of such limited supplemental special tax in any way, directly or indirectly, be used to offset or be applied as any form of credit against any funds the District is entitled to receive from all sources, including any other special tax revenue the District presently receives or hereafter will receive.

Section 18: The limited supplemental special parcel tax provided by this Resolution shall be supplemental and in addition to any other District special tax currently in force and effect or which hereafter becomes operative.

Section 19: The provisions of this Resolution shall apply to five consecutive fiscal years (2025/2026 through 2029/2030) after which time this Resolution shall lapse, and the limited supplemental special parcel tax provided by this Resolution shall expire and be of no further force or effect unless extended or renewed by the voters prior to the expiration hereof in accordance with, and as provided by, law.

Section 20: For the purposes of this Resolution the following definitions shall apply:

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(a) The term "Single Family Residential Property" means any parcel that contains a single dwelling unit, or any parcel that contains a residential structure consisting of two or more dwelling units that share common walls. have separate Assessor's Parcel Numbers assigned to them (except for a duplex triplex, or fourplex unit, which may share a Parcel with another duplex. triplex or fourplex Unit(s)), and may be purchased by individual homebuyers (which shall still be the case even if the dwelling units are purchased and subsequently offered for rent by the owner of the dwelling unit), including such residential structures that meet the statutory definition of a condominium project contained in Civil Code \$4125. Any incidental use of such property for "in-home" businesses such as bookkeeping, seamstress, secretarial and other such incidental home-business use shall not affect this classification. Typical San Mateo County Use Codes designating Single Family Residential Property include "01", "07", "51", "52", "53", and "97", as those Use Codes may be amended in the future.

(b) The term "Accessory Dwelling Unit" or "ADU" means a secondary residential unit of limited size, as defined in California Government Code §66313, as may be amended from time to time, that is accessory to a single dwelling unit. The ADU may be on the same parcel as the single dwelling unit or on a separate parcel. For purposes of clarification, where an ADU and primary dwelling unit are on the same parcel, the ADU located on such parcel is considered a separate dwelling unit from the primary dwelling unit on such parcel for purposes of the special tax. Should a parcel contain only an ADU, such parcel will be taxed as an ADU only.

(c) The term "Multi-Family Residential Property" means any parcel that contains a residential structure with two or more dwelling units that share a single Assessor's Parcel Number, are offered for rent to the general public, and cannot be purchased by individual homebuyers. Typical San Mateo County Use Codes designating *Multi-Family Residential Property* include "02", "03", "04", "05", "08", "09", "91", "92", "93", "94", "95", "96", and "98", as those Use Codes may be amended in the future.

(d) The term "Residential Care Property" means any parcel that contains a residential structure used to provide long or short-term care for compensation on a permanent or temporary housing basis of any kind. This includes rest homes, convalescent homes, short-term care homes, long-term care homes, and rooming houses. The typical San Mateo County Use Code designating *Residential Care Property* is "75", as that Use Code may be amended in the future, but the *Residential Care Property* designation may be applied to parcels with other Use Codes if such parcels are determined to be *Residential Care Property* by the District.

(e) The term "Non-Residential Property" means any parcel on which a for-profit or non-profit enterprise, or religious institution, is located, or which is used for a commercial purpose, exclusive of *Multi-Family Residential Property* and *Residential Care Property*. Typical San Mateo County Use Codes designating Non-Residential Property include "06", "11", "12", "13", "14", "15", "16", "17", "18", "19", "21", "22", "23", "24", "25", "26", "27", "28", "29", "31", "32", "33", "34", "35", "36", "37", "38", "39", "59", "61", "62", "63", "64", "65", "66", "67", "68", "69", "71", "72", "73", "74", "76", "77", "78", "79", as those Use Codes may be amended in the future.

(f) The term "Undeveloped Property" means any parcel of land wholly without any improvements of any kind whatsoever. The typical San Mateo County Use Code designating *Undeveloped Property* is "00", as that Use Code may be amended in the future.

(g) The term "fiscal year" is defined as twelve consecutive calendar months over two consecutive calendar years commencing July 1 of each calendar year and ending June 30 of the succeeding calendar year.

(h) The term "parcel" is defined as any unit of land situated entirely or partly within the District that now either now has or acquires a separate Assessor's Parcel Number and/or which now receives, or which will hereafter receive, a separate tax bill from the San Mateo County Tax Collector. In the event of a conflict between these two definitions, the "separate tax bill" definition shall control except where two or more parcels are combined by the Assessor for taxing purposes, in which event the total special tax on all parcels so combined shall be assessed irrespective of the single tax bill.

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Section 21: Specific Purpose of Special Parcel Tax.

(a) The proceeds of the limited supplemental special parcel tax shall only be used for the specific purpose of funding the District's costs of providing police protection, crime prevention and emergency response services and programs, as well as the costs of administering the special parcel tax, including, but not limited to, the costs of the election, and the costs of collection, and for no other purposes.

(b) For the purposes of this Resolution, the "District's costs of providing police protection, crime prevention and emergency response services and programs" as set forth in subsection (a) above include, but are not limited to, the following: All costs of capital, salaries and benefits, overtime, station maintenance, capital improvements and acquisitions, office equipment and supplies, motor vehicle acquisition and maintenance, utility expenses, insurance premiums, legal fees, and operational costs of the District.

Section 22: The proceeds of the limited supplemental special parcel tax shall be deposited in a special account, created and maintained by the District, and used only for the specific purpose identified in Section 21 of this Resolution.

Section 23: The chief fiscal officer of the District shall cause a report (the "Report") to be prepared by an independent auditor and to be filed with the Board of Police Commissioners no later than January 1, 2027, and January 1 of each year thereafter that the tax is collected until January 1, 2031. The Report shall state: (a) the amount of special parcel tax proceeds collected and expended in such year; and (b) the status of any projects or description of any programs funded from proceeds of the special parcel tax. The Report may relate to the calendar year, fiscal year, or other appropriate annual period, as the chief fiscal officer of the District shall determine, and may be incorporated into or filed with the annual budget, audit, or other appropriate routine report to the Board.

Section 24: Effective Date. Pursuant to California Constitution Article XIII C §(2)(d) and California Elections Code §9320, if two-thirds of the voters voting in the election on this Measure vote in favor of the adoption of such Measure, this Resolution shall be deemed valid and binding and shall be considered as adopted upon the date that the vote is declared by the Board of Police Commissioners or elections official, if required, and shall go into effect ten (10) days after that date.

Section 25: If any part, subpart, section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, paragraph, subparagraph, or other provision of this Resolution is determined and is so declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the reminder of this Resolution. The people of the Broadmoor Police Protection District hereby declare that they would have adopted this Resolution, and each part, subpart, section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, paragraph, subparagraph and provision hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more parts, subparts, sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, paragraphs, subparagraphs, or provisions be determined and declared to be invalid.

BACKGROUND

The Board of Police Commissioners is comprised of three residents of the District who are elected at-large. The term of each commissioner is four years. Of the three seats on the Board of Police Commissioners one seat will be up for election this year for a four-year term.

DISCUSSION

As has been the practice of the District, elections to the Board of Police Commissioners are consolidated with county, state or national elections. Such a practice results in a greater number of residents voting and it significantly reduces the cost of the election to the District. The next General Election will be on November 5, 2024.

Notice of hearing on ordering an election and to combine the election with the General Election on November 5, 2024, has been properly given.

RECOMMENDATION

I recommend that the Commission approve and adopt proposed Resolution 2024/25-02, a copy of which I have attached to this Staff Report, which will order the election and combine that election with the General Election on November 5, 2024.

A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR AN ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 5, 2024, OF ONE MEMBER AT LARGE OF THE BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, an election has been ordered to be held on November 5, 2024, in the Broadmoor Police Protection District for the purpose of electing one member of the Board of Police Commissioners ("Board"); and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code \$1001 there is an established General statewide election to be held on the same date; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Part 3, Consolidation of Elections, and commencing with Elections Code \$10400 an election for members of the Board may be either completely or partially consolidated with another election held on the same day, if in the same territory or in territory that is part the same; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code §1002 the Board desires to adopt this resolution to request that the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo permit the County's the San Mateo County Chief Elections Officer & Assessor-County Clerk-Recorder (the "Chief Elections Officer") to render specified services to the Broadmoor Police Protection District ("District") relating to the conduct of the November 5, 2024, election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1. An election is hereby called to be held in and for the District on November 5, 2024, to elect one member to and of the Board for a full term of four years.

Section 2. Pursuant to Elections Code §10002 the Board of Police Commissioners of the District hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo to make available the services of the San Mateo County Chief Elections Officer & Assessor – County Clerk – Recorder (the "Chief Elections Officer") as the County Elections Official for the purpose of rendering services in the conduct of the election to be held on November 5, 2024.

Section 3. The District election is to be held on November 5, 2024, and will be conducted at-large.

Section 4. Pursuant to Elections Code §10509 not less than 125 days prior to the date of the election the District Secretary shall deliver a notice to the Chief Elections Officer. The notice shall bear the secretary's signature and the district seal and shall also contain both of the following:

(a) The elective offices of the jurisdiction to be filled at the next general district election, specifying which offices, if any, are for the balance of an unexpired term.

(b) Whether the jurisdiction or the candidate is to pay for the publication of a candidate statement.

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Section 5. Pursuant to Elections Code §10522 at least 125 days prior to the day fixed for the general district election, the secretary of a resident voting district shall deliver to the county elections official of each affected county a map showing the boundaries of the district and the boundaries of the divisions of the district, if any, within that county and a statement indicating in which divisions a director is to be elected and whether any elective officer is to be elected at-large at the next general district election.

Section 6. The Interim District Manager of the Broadmoor Police Protection District, or his/her designee, is hereby authorized and directed to enter an Elections Service Agreement with the Chief Elections Officer regarding the election to be held on November 5, 2024, to outline the detailed services to be provided by both the District and the Chief Elections Officer.

Section 7. The Chief Elections Officer will send an itemized invoice to the District for all services provided pursuant to the Elections Service Agreement after the election is conducted and all related costs are determined, and the Interim District Manager of the District or his/her designee, is hereby authorized and directed to submit payment on the full amount of the invoice to the County of San Mateo within forty-five (45) days of the date of the invoice.

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Section 8. Pursuant to Elections §13307 each candidate for the Board's one seat to be voted on in the election to be held on November 5, 2024, may prepare a candidate statement on the appropriate form provided by the Chief Elections Officer. Such statement shall be limited to 200 words. The prorated costs of printing, mailing and translating the statements shall be paid by the candidate.

The District's Reserve Officer Unit was decommissioned and disbanded a few years ago by the police chief at the time because it was not functioning efficiently or in the best interest of the District.

The current Chief, Chief Connolly, along with staff have come up with a plan to reform and reestablish the Reserve Officer Unit and have begun a recruiting process.

DISCUSSION

The Chief of Police has appointed Sergeant Gamboa as the Reserve Coordinator to oversee the operation of a new Reserve Officer Unit. Sergeant Gamboa has many years of experience, including significant involvement in and with the state's Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training.

Penal Code §830.6 allows the District to appoint reserve police officers. Penal Code §830.6(a)(2) requires the District to adopt a Resolution for the appointment of Reserve Police Officers appointed pursuant to that statute. The attached [proposed] form of Resolution will comply with that statute.

The [proposed] Resolution will also reaffirm and ratify the Chief's reestablishment of the Reserve Officer Unit.

WHEREAS, among those volunteers has been Reserve Police Officers who have provided invaluable law enforcement and related duties to the District; and,

WHEREAS, a few years ago it became necessary to disband the Reserve Officer Unit of the District and release all personnel serving as Reserve Police Officers; and,

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police / District Manager has determined that reestablishment of the Reserve Officer Unit of the District can be accomplished in a manner that will very beneficial and to once provide great benefits to the District and the residents it serves.

NOW, THEREFORE;

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT the Reserve Officer Unit of the District has been reestablished and reconstituted by the Chief of Police / District Manager, and that such action is hereby approved and ratified. The Unit shall be under the direct control and command of the Chief of Police / District manager and any subordinate employee of the District that the Chief of Police / District Manager may designate and appoint for such purpose;

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED THAT the Chief of Police / District Manager may hire persons who qualify as Level I, Level II or Level III Reserve Officers, and shall appoint such persons as Reserve Police Officers pursuant to Penal Code §830.6(a) at the Level the Chief of Police / District Manager in his or her sole discretion shall determine that is consistent with their level of training as prescribed by Penal Code §832.6, 11 CCR §1007, and P.O.S.T. Administrative Manual §1007;

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED THAT those persons who qualify for appointment as Level I Reserve Police Officers pursuant to Penal Code §832.6(a) may, in the sole discretion of the Chief of Police / District Manager, be appointed either as (i) Level I Reserve Police Officers pursuant to Penal Code §830.6(a)(1) referred to in the P.O.S.T. Administrative Manual as "nondesignated Level I Reserve Officer" or as (ii) Level I Reserve Police Officers pursuant to Penal Code §830.6(a)(2) referred to in the P.O.S.T Administrative Manual as "designated Level I Reserve Officer; BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED THAT the Chief of Police / District Manager in his or her sole discretion may appoint any qualified Reserve Police Officer at a Level lower than the Level that he or she may legally qualify for appointment;

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED THAT, as the appointing authority, the District intends that this Resolution conform to the provisions and meet the requirements of Penal Code §830.6(a)(2). The Chief of Police / District Manager is hereby authorized and empowered to appoint designated Level I Reserve Police Officers individually or by class pursuant to the provisions of Penal Code §830.6(a)(2);

BE IT FURTHER HEREBY RESOLVED THAT all Reserve Police Officers of the District shall serve at the pleasure of the Chief of Police / District manager and they shall serve without any form of compensation or benefits.

On July 2, 2024, The Broadmoor Police Protection District (the "District") established an agreement with NBS to perform annual administrative services, and in addition, a one-time auditing service associated with the parcels subject to the District's Police Protection Special Tax (the "Special Tax").

The District's Special Tax went into effect on July 1, 2000, as ordered by Resolution No. 1999/2000-09 (the "Authorizing Resolution") pursuant to Government Code section 50075 and as a result of an approval of 2/3 of the electorate, pursuant to Section 4 of Article XIIIA of the California Constitution.

NBS's audit (the "Parcel Audit") focuses on reviewing each parcel's San Mateo County Assessor's Secured Roll data, comparing aerial and street view satellite imagery, and identifying additional data sources as needed. This review is conducted to confirm the correct land use classifications and accuracy of the corresponding applied rates in accordance with the Authorizing Resolution. Additionally, NBS compares the findings to previously assigned classifications and rate application to determine the changes required for accurate special tax revenue collection.

The summary below highlights the findings of the Parcel Audit and the impact on the Special Tax levy.

(1) Includes three Mixed-Use Parcels. Refer to Exhibit A for specific changes.

As indicated in the table above, NBS was able to determine that the Special Tax was under-levied by \$270,819.72 in FY 2023/24. In most cases of incorrect levy amounts, the Special Tax rate was either not applied per the Authorizing Resolution on a per unit (Multi-Family) or per bed (Residential Care) basis, or the rate was entirely incorrect (Non-Residential).

For FY 2024/25, the total year-over-year increase in revenue is \$284,360.70 as a result of the Parcel Audit findings and the additional application of the 5% rate increase. Of the total 1,533 taxable parcels in the District, 136 parcels were identified as being levied in a manner not in accordance with the Authorizing Resolution in FY 2023/24 (and prior years). By classification type, these include:

- 41 Multi-Family Residential parcels
- 64 Non-Residential parcels
- 26 Residential Care parcels
- 2 Single Family Residential parcels
- 3 Mixed-Use parcels

The complete list of parcels determined to require corrections can be found in Exhibit A of this memo.

Muti-Family Residential Parcels

- 41 Multi-Family Residential parcels were levied an incorrect rate.
 - o 38 were levied a "Single-Family Residential" rate.
 - Three were levied a "Non-Residential" rate.
- The rates were incorrectly applied on a per-parcel basis rather than the correct per-unit basis as specified in the Authorizing Resolution.
- The difference in revenue for Multi-Family Residential parcels totals \$201,670.09. For specific
 parcel changes, please refer to Exhibit A of this memo.

Non-Residential Parcels

- All 64 Non-Residential parcels were levied an incorrect rate.
 - Eight were levied an "Undeveloped" rate.
 - o Ten parcels were levied a "Single-Family Residential" rate.
 - 46 parcels were levied a rate of \$1,055.25 which is not listed in the Resolution No. 2023/24-02 which set the rates for FY 2023/24.
- Among these, nine parcels that were previously levied the "Single-Family Residential" rate are known to be Airbnb parcels. These have now been correctly reassigned a "Non-Residential" rate, as directed by the District.
- Non-Residential parcels are levied on a per-business basis. Two parcels were identified to have more than one business on the parcel.
- The difference in revenue for Non-Residential parcels totals \$15,985.48. For specific parcel changes, please refer to Exhibit A of this memo.

Residential Care Parcels

- 26 Residential Care parcels were levied an incorrect rate.
 - 19 were levied a "Single-Family Residential" rate per parcel.
 - Five were levied a "Non-Residential" rate per parcel.
 - Two parcels were levied an amount not found in Resolution No. 2023/24-02 of \$1,055.25.
- Residential Care parcels were previously not levied on a "per bed" basis. Exhibit A reflects the
 application of the rate per bed, as directed by the District.

 The difference in revenue for Residential Care parcels totals \$43,095.35. For specific parcel changes, please refer to Exhibit A of this memo.

Single-Family Residential Parcels

- Two Single-Family Residential parcels were levied an incorrect rate.
 - o One parcel was levied a "Non-Residential" rate.
 - o One parcel was levied an "Undeveloped" rate.
- The difference in Single-Family Residential revenue totals (\$257.98). For specific parcel changes, please refer to Exhibit A of this memo.

Mixed-Use Parcels

- · There are currently 3 parcels that have been reclassified as "Mixed-Use".
- The Special Tax amounts were computed by applying the "Single-Family Residential" rate to the
 residential units on the parcel and applying the "Non-Residential" rate to the commercial units
 on the parcel and adding them together, per the District's direction.
- The difference in revenue for Mixed-Use parcels totals \$10,326.78. For specific parcel changes, please refer to Exhibit A of this memo.

Scope of Services

In-Person Parcel Audit

AUDIT SCOPE

The goal of this audit ("Project") is to accurately record the data relevant to calculating the annual levies for parcels within the Broadmoor Police Protection District's ("District") Parcel Tax. Having completed an audit of the Parcel Tax Data via electronic media such as the County Assessor's Secured Property Roll, secondary market data, and available Google Earth satellite imagery, it was found that some taxable uses must be verified in person. It is anticipated the data will be used for the purpose of computing the annual levy of the Parcel Tax beginning in Fiscal Year 2025/26.

INTRODUCTION AND PROJECT SCHEDULE

NBS will coordinate with District staff and other interested parties to:

- Establish lines of communication for effective interaction of all involved parties.
- Clarify the specific project goals and criteria needed to meet the District's preference
- Identify any special circumstances regarding the project, if any
- Develop a working schedule to achieve agreed upon project milestones

DATA COLLECTION AND RESEARCH

NBS will compile the list of parcels from the prior audit with remaining uses to be identified. Following confirmation of the list with the District, NBS will perform an in person review of said properties by driving through the boundary of the District and visibly identifying additional units, usage of property, etc. as necessary to determine the correct method of taxing the property.

DATA ANALYSIS

NBS will analyze obtained data, perform certain cross-checks and provide findings to the District for review. The District may need to provide certain final determinations with regard to any exceptional circumstances.

SUMMARY MEMO

NBS will provide a summary memo explaining the review process and highlighting any large changes to the parcel data and assessments.

Multi-Year Parcel Tax Levy Data Audit

AUDIT SCOPE

The goal of this audit ("Project") is to determine what the annual levies for parcels within the Broadmoor Police Protection District's ("District") Parcel Tax have been since 2011 or as far back as possible based on County records. NBS understands that the need of the District is to determine how the files were submitted, the party responsible for determining the charges, and if possible what occurred to make the changes that resulted in incorrect levies being charged.

DATA GATHERING

NBS will act as a liaison for the District with the County of San Mateo and will request levy data files for years 2011 through 2023. NBS will request communications relating to the levy submittals in each year and assist the District with the completion of any necessary public information requests if necessary. NBS will attend calls and virtual meetings with District's legal counsel to assist in the process. Expert witness testimony will result in additional charges.

DATA ANALYSIS

NBS will analyze the data provided by the County and the District in each year data is provided. NBS will attempt to identify the classifications of the parcels, application of the annually approved rates, and to the extent possible, the source of any misapplications of the methodology.

TERMS

Consulting services will be invoiced on a monthly basis as the project progresses. Expenses will be itemized and included in the next regular invoice. Fees for all other services will be invoiced upon completion of the task. If the project is prematurely terminated by either party, NBS shall receive payment for work completed. Payment shall be made within 30 days of submittal of an invoice. If payment is not received within 90 days simple interest will begin to accrue at the rate of 1.5% per month. Either party can cancel this contract with 30 days written notice.

DISTRICT'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The District shall furnish NBS with any pertinent information that is available to District and applicable to the Services. The District shall designate a person to act with authority on its behalf in respect to the Services. The District shall promptly respond to NBS' requests for reviews and approvals of its work, and to its requests for decisions related to the Services. District understands and agrees that NBS is entitled to rely on all information, data and documents (collectively, "Information") supplied to NBS by District or any of its agents, contractors or proxies or obtained by NBS from other usual and customary sources including other government sources or proxies as being accurate and correct and NBS will have no obligation to confirm that such Information is correct and that NBS will have no liability to District or any third party if such Information is not correct.

INDEMNIFICATION

NBS shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless District, its officers, employees, officials and agents from and against all claims, demands, losses, liabilities, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, (collectively "Liabilities") arising out of or resulting from the negligence or willful misconduct of NBS or a breach by NBS of its obligations under this Agreement, except to the extent such Liabilities are caused by



the negligence or willful misconduct of District. NBS will not be liable to the District or anyone who may claim any right due to a relationship with District, for any acts or omissions in the performance of Services under this Agreement, unless those acts or omissions are due to the negligence or willful misconduct of NBS. Except in the case of NBS' negligence, willful misconduct or breach of its obligations under this Agreement, District shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless NBS, its officers, directors, shareholders, employees and agents from and against all Liabilities to the extent that such Liabilities arise out of NBS performing Services pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, including, without limitation, any Liabilities arising as a result of District or any of its agents or contractors supplying incorrect Information or documentation to NBS. The provisions of this Section shall survive termination of this Agreement.
